This action, coming on the eve of the drive to secure \$25,000 in the state of Oregon, is surely a good omen and doubly insures success of the campaign for subscribers know that they will never be called upon for future maintenance. Shares of stock are \$25 each and are non-assessable. It is not expected that there will be a direct dividend, any surplus going to increase the premium list and in other ways enhancing the value of the exposition to the northwest. Indirect dividends, however, will be large and accrue to every stockholder as a result of the increased and stable prosperity which comes from agricultural and live stock wealth as from no other source. It is expected that bankers, business men of all kinds, as well as breeders and live stock men will subscribe liberally to the stock.

WALKING ON ALL FOURS KEEPS WM. FARNUM IN TRIM

When our ancestors on the borderland between animal and man abandoned the four-footed method of walking in favor of the more dignified style in vogue today, they doomed humanity to ill and ailments.

This is the theory of William Farnum, the star of the William Fox photoplay "For Freedom" last showing today. He doesn't claim it as his own discovery, but the fact that he practices what he preaches along this line of training adds weight to his contention. Walking on all fours is a part of his system of keeping in trim, and it is a well-known fact that no one in filmdom can boast such a physique.

"The trouble with the human race is that it was too proud ages ago," said Mr. Farnum "before the coming of man the dwellers on the face of the earth walked in the natural method, on all fours. Animals of today walk in the same manner. Wild animals are never subject to such ill as we humans are forced to experience, in fact, they are seldom ill at all. Domestic animals are sick occasionally because the separating contact with mankind, leaves its impression upon them.

"Now all this being true, there must be something in the theory that I uphold,—that the great change for the worse came when our ancestors learned to walk on two feet. But please do not go away with the impression that I am in favor of having us go back to the old manner of walking.

"That would be ridiculous. But let me cite a few instances to prove that walking on all fours is a valuable part of any system of physical training.

"Our football players of today must crouch on toes, knees and hands and learn to charge forward like steam engines under full steam. Show me better specimens of muscular humanity if you can."

"The soldiers of our army have many exercises that bring them into the position our ancestors adopted when walking on all fours.

"Our American Indians when striking game or early settlers adopted the four-footed method because it enabled them to move about so lightly and invisibly.

"By reverting to the four-footed method, I mean include in your physical training exercises such stunts as crawling about on all fours; holding the body rigid, resting it in this state on toes and hands; lowering the head and shoulders to the floor by bending the arms and raising them to the original position by straightening the arms. There are many varieties of this exercise and they are all valuable because they bring into play muscles that are little used nowadays."

Oregon is to receive more than \$1,000,000 additional money for post roads and forest roads from the federal government during the next three years in accordance with the provisions of a bill which has just passed congress.
