

MACEDONIA IS A COUNTRY OF VERY SMALL POPULATION

Many Villages Had Furnished Background for Allies.

SALONIKI, Jan. 24. (By Mail) —Macedonia at present strikes one as a peaceful and well-organized country, with little or no population.

The allied army of Macedonia, too, is dwindling and it gives one a feeling of strangeness to travel up and down Macedonia and see familiar places which once were populous with allied troops now deserted.

The writer passed through Doiran the other day. It once was a pretty little town, picturesquely situated on the shore of Lake Doiran, and during the greater part of the war was only a few hundred yards beyond the British lines, in enemy territory.

Population Slowly Filters Back. The population is slowly filtering back, but the chief things that they find are the excellent roads made by the British—the best roads in Macedonia since the days of the Romans.

The old "Macedonian question" still awaits solution. It contained the seeds of trouble and grief for the whole of humanity. Viewed from here, the war seems to have done absolutely nothing to settle the problems of the mixed and warring races in these regions.

It is generally felt here that Turkey needs a strong master and the Balkans a kindly but firm friend who will ordain their future on a basis of right and justice and conditioned partly, though not wholly, on the parts played by various nations in the war.
