**RECORD FOR PORK IS EXPECTED**

Not Enough Hogs in the Country to Meet the Demand Says Experts. CHICAGO, March 7.—The balloon has been cut loose according to experts today commenting on the untaxed price of hogs. Packing house officials said they expected immediate advances in live hog prices to set marks above the \$20 record set last winter.

"Prices will be up for two or three years to come," said F. W. Waddell, head of Armour & Co's pork and provision department. "Lifting of the embargo on pork exports, of course, opens much new territory. There isn't enough pork on hand to meet this demand."

"The live hog supply in this country is almost exhausted. The farmer rushed his hogs to market while the food administration had a fixed price for his animals."

Live hog prices have advanced in the last week in the belief that no price would be fixed. Grains, slowed up in a nervous market here, were expected to react today to the hog price announcement. Sharp rises were predicted from the opening of the markets. Charges that the farmer, sure of a high price for wheat, has neglected corn, a necessary adjunct to the pork business, were made by meat experts.

Unofficially some startling high prices were named as possible records for both grains and meats.

**HISTORY OF TAHITI**

Much Valuable Information Polynesian Has Been Compiled.

PAPEETE, ISLAND OF TAHITI, Feb. 7.—(By Mail)—There has been a revival of interest here among Europeans residing on the island in the history and lore of Tahiti inspired by a wish to identify and preserve landmarks of historic value which, if left for any considerable period, would be lost to the memory of man.

Among the relics preserved has been the proper marking of the burial place of the Reverend Henry Nott, one of the first, and considered the greatest, of the missionaries who came to the South Seas in the early days.

The mission sent out from England to Tahiti in 1796 was the first undertaken by the London Missionary Society after its formation. The Reverend Henry Nott was of this company who landed from the ship Duff, commanded by Captain James Wilson, at Matavai Bay, Tahiti, in 1797. From that time until his death in 1844 he labored without ceasing in the island. It was he who first translated the scriptures, direct from the original Hebrew and Greek texts, into the Tahitian language. He alone, of all the missionaries who were on the island during the troublous times in the opening of the nineteenth century when the island was torn and devastated by intertribal wars, remained steadfastly at his post.

Strange it may seem, information in regard to Mr. Nott obtainable at the headquarters of the London Missionary Society in London is meager. One of the three Europeans who have been interested in finding and marking his resting place, made inquiries during a recent visit to the English capital as to what knowledge the society had of him. It was discovered that the society had no record of Mr. Nott's death, nor did they know where he was buried. All they could say was that as the years rolled by Mr. Nott's fame as a great missionary increased and more and

more interest was being shown in his commanding personality. His grave, long neglected and nearly forgotten, now is properly marked. A substantial wall has been built around it and the natives of the district, remembering the debt they owe his memory, have filled the enclosure with flowering plants.

Ellis' Polynesian Researches, considered as the most authoritative book on old Tahiti, is regarded as the best source of information on the work of Mr. Nott in the islands. It was from Mr. Nott that Mr. Ellis who came to the islands in 1818, obtained the knowledge of native lore and customs.
