

FROM ABROAD IN THE STATE.

A steamship line between Portland and the ports of China is desired both by China and Portland, declared speakers before the Portland Ad club Wednesday afternoon at the Benson hotel.

Senator Chamberlain, who will address the Sphinx club in New York Monday, may make the trip to that city by airplane next Sunday. His son, Dr. Charles T. Chamberlain of Portland, and Mrs. Chamberlain made a flight in an army airplane over the city of Washington Wednesday.

The West Coast Lumbermen's association has arranged to open an office in New York city for the purpose of securing a share of the New England lumber trade. This office will be in charge of Chester J. Hoque, who has been Oregon secretary of the association since 1916, with office in Portland. Mr. Hoque will leave for the east tonight, first visiting the annual exposition of American railway appliances at Chicago and going direct from there to New York.

Clearings of Portland banks for the week ending Thursday totaled \$27,458,695.25 compared with \$19,480,672.75 for the corresponding week of last year, a gain of approximately 41 per cent.

Distinction of being the first vessel flying any but a German flag to pass through the famous Kiel canal fell to the lot of a Portland built craft, the 8500-ton steamship Westward Ho, built by the Columbia River Shipbuilding corporation and launched December 1, 1917.

Members of the city council of Haines, "the biggest little town in Oregon" at their meeting Thursday evening went on record as being unanimously in favor of the league of nations plan as outlined by President Wilson.
