## MRS. L. M'CLURE PIONEER PASSES

DEATH OF WELL-KNOWN RESIDENT AT HOME OF DAUGHTER.

Mrs. L. M'Clure, aged 81 years and 9 months, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Hattie Ferguson, 906 North Fir street, March 7, 1919. Mrs. M'Clure was an Oregon pioneer of 1852 and also one of the oldest and most widely known residents of Grande Ronde. Mrs. M'Clure crossed the plains by ox team in 1852 and settled in the Willamette valley. She was married to Chas. M'Clure in Eugene in 1857, and they later removed to Grande Ronde and became residents of the Ladd Canyon neighborhood, where they remained for many years. The year 1864 was the date of arrival of Mr. and Mrs. M'Clure in this valley and the union was broken by the death of Mr. M'Clure sixteen years ago—March 28, 1893.

There are five surviving children: James M. and Frank M'Clure and Mrs. Hattie Ferguson, of La Grande; William and Charles L. M'Clure, of Clayton, Idaho. There are also seventeen grand children and nine great-grandchildren.

The funeral will be held from the Henry undertaking parlors Sunday, March 9, at 2:30 o'clock in the afternoon. The interment will be in the Masonic cemetery.

## WOUNDED TAKE OLD JOBS Men Trained at Army Hospitals to Resume Former Occupations.

WASHINGTON, March 7.—Twenty-nine per cent of the wounded soldiers at army hospitals in which education departments have been established were enrolled during January in some form of education work. The physical reconstruction division of the surgeon-general's office in a report today said 562 disabled men resumed their old occupations in January as the result of this training.

## 3662 TONS OF GAS USED Director of American Chemical Warfare Service Reports.

WASHINGTON, March 7.—In a report today to General March, chief of staff, Major-General William L. Sibert, director of the chemical warfare service, stated that his organization shipped to Europe 3662 tons of gas or its equivalent, which was loaded into shells and used by American and allied troops against the enemy. General Sibert's report was called for in view of published statements that no American gas shells were fired at the enemy.
