NEW YORK, March 11.—When the famous 27th Division, made up of New York's former state guardsmen, returns from overseas, it will have a reception here in keeping with its record in France. It is proposed to acquire Pelhamwood, near which Quentin Roosevelt and so many other brave young Americans lie buried where they fell, and make of it a Roosevelt memorial cemetery.

What more fitting than that this tribute to a great American who gave so much to France should at the same time be a tribute to the sister republic, which a generation ago erected the Statue of Liberty at our gates?

Babylon Outdone The hanging gardens of Babylon will not be a patch on the hanging gardens of New York City, if the legislature takes seriously a bill just introduced in Albany.

The bill provides that these gardens are to be built on elevated structures, and shall be erected wherever the park commission decides. In them—or on them—are to be laid out tennis courts, baseball diamonds, running tracks and open air motion picture theatres. The hanging gardens are to form a checkerboard as they may be built on alternate blocks.

WAS HISTORICAL SPOT

Old Mining Town in Nevada Is to Become a "Ghost City."

LOS ANGELES, March 11.—Aurora, Nevada, the bone of contention between California and Nevada in 1851 and a center of mining activities since that time, soon is to join the "ghost cities" of the west, it became known here recently.

Aurora was the first mining town in Nevada, according to mining men and millions were taken from its mines before the ore began to give out.

The Aurora Consolidated Copper company soon will remove its 100-stamp mill and with this mill will go the main support of the town. A large sum was expended in 1916 by the company for the handling of low grade ore but the plan proved unsuccessful.

The uncertainty of the exact location of the eastern boundary line of California kept Aurora a bone of contention between that state and Nevada for over two years. The spring of 1861 finding Aurora a new and rapidly growing town, the California legislature organized the county of Mono and established the seat of justice at Aurora.

Governor Nye arrived in Nevada in July, 1861, and became convinced that Aurora was in Nevada, and proceeded on that assumption.

This first territorial legislature was created with Aurora as its meeting place, making that city the seat of justice of two counties, under the laws of one state and one territory, complicating matters greatly.

Following much controversy, the state line was established through Lake Tahoe, thus placing Aurora in Nevada.
