CITY MANAGER'S WEEKLY REPORT

I have to report for the week ending March 13: From the police department, fourteen arrests; 9 for drunkenness; one for having liquor in possession; two for violating traffic violations; one electric wiring without license; fines collected \$108.

From the fire department, one fire call at 701 Jefferson avenue, property of John Ryhorst and occupied by Mr. Mitchell. The chief was unable to ascertain the cause of fire. George Williams, fireman, has left the employ of the city and John W. Neville has been appointed in his stead. The fire hose shipped to factory some time ago to be re-lined has been returned and appears to be satisfactory.

The street and water force have been employed principally in cleaning streets, repairing crosswalks and removing snow from walks and gutters. Twelve loads of rock were hauled to the pipe line at the river and placed on same to protect against the spring floods. The expenditures for the week in the two departments were \$88.27. A force of men has been put on at the septic tank and same is being cleaned out.

A number of letters have been received from other cities regarding the parking of cars in the center of streets. This plan seems to be very satisfactory where used. The correspondence regarding same is submitted herewith.

The commissioners, the street superintendent and the manager visited North La Grande on the 11th to look into the matter of sidewalk petitioned for in that district and were of the opinion that same should be constructed as petitioned for.

It is the intention to make a thorough inspection of all walks in the near future as many of them are in bad shape and to have the necessary repairs made as soon as can be done.

Properly owners are required to keep their walks in repair and the provision of the city ordinances will be enforced.

I submit herewith letters received from Mr. Thomson and others regarding the matter of a consulting engineer for the contemplated changes in the Beaver Creek water system.

Sentences of Espionage Violators and Military Offenders Commuted.

LEAVENWORTH, Kans., March 13.—Men confined at the federal prison here for violation of the espionage act and for military offenses are receiving clemency from the department of justice and the war department, it became known today.

In some instances immediate discharges are being granted, but in the majority commutation of sentences are being ordered.

One Feels Himself Grow in This Master Screen Story

"It may be rank heresy on my part, but it does appear that the opportunities are greater in pictures, especially the development we experience under such master personages in the film world as William Farnum, the famous motion picture star. In no whit is an actor's talent lessened when he enters the silent world of expression. Rather it seems to me like those is a broader bent.

"One can feel himself grow in a master story of the screen, such as 'When a Man Sees Red,' an adaptation of Larry Evans' great story of 'The Painted Lady,' which appeared in the Saturday Evening Post. In this great picture I had opportunities that never would come to one on the stage.

The matron, Luther Smith, is a lovable, strong man, who is grievously wronged, and he develops another side, the strong, red-blooded fighting man, whose fighting instincts come to the fore in the most remarkable fighting climax ever witnessed, either on the stage or in pictures. I do not believe that it is possible to reproduce the gripping scenes of this picture on the more prosaic stage.

The rugged, red-blooded type of man is displacing the merely pretty man. Because a man is pretty to look at, because he is big and athletic does not mean so much these days. Might and muscle mean nothing, unless there is strength of mind, the subtle power which makes a man realize that, though his opponent may be stronger, more powerful physically, yet it means nothing compared to the superior knowledge—knowledge of right—and the will that engenders it.
