Story of Third Oregon Told by Colonel May to Portland Writer

A lengthy article in the Portland Oregonian, based on a story concerning the old Third Oregon regiment, related by Colonel May, commander of that unit, to an Oregonian writer, was read with interest by many local people a few days ago, many of the officers named in the story being well known to many in La Grande. For those who may not have seen the story in the Oregonian, the following extract is reprinted in The Observer:

"Lieutenant Pillbury of Portland was promoted to captain and returned as brigade adjutant at Camp Dodge, Ia. Captain James E. Neer of Salem, Lieutenant Stevens, Lieutenant Eilenberg, Lieutenant Paul Wallace and Lieutenant Chenoweth and Lieutenant Compton were transferred to the 23rd Infantry, joining and participating in the St. Mihiel drive.

Salem Man Shows Bravery.
"The next day after his transfer Captain Neer went over the top for the first time. Just as soon as his men had gone over a German shell dropped on his first platoon, killing and wounding forty-two of the fifty-seven men. There was a gap to his right, which one company had failed to go over.

"I like to think that Captain Neer, in his first experience acted with typical Oregonian promptitude. He noticed the gap, even while the echo of the German shell was sounding and deployed the remainder of his company to fill the vacant section of line. All this was done under heavy shell fire, with all the coolness of a veteran. Captain Neer, in civilian life, is a barber at Salem.

"Every one of the officers I have mentioned, with the exception of Captain Neer, was returned wounded within ten days after they reached the front lines. Lieutenant Stevens was killed in the St. Mihiel fight.

"Captain Murphy of Corvallis, Lieutenant Manke and Lieutenant Manning of Portland were transferred to guard company No. 2 after the armistice was signed and stationed in Paris.

"On the reorganization of the division for return, Captain Miller of McMinnville, Lieutenant Shirley of McMinnville, Captain Alexander of company C, Portland; Captain Walter Finn of Dallas, Lieutenant Walker of Portland wished further service in France and were assigned to duty with the First infantry replacement unit. Captain Dana Allen of Salem was transferred to the judge advocate-general's department and placed on duty with the Second army corps.

TRAGIC SITUATION

Jews in Poland Clamor to Join Relatives in United States

LONDON, March 19.—The Jewish situation in Poland and Lithuania is so tragic that thousands are starving and tens of thousands clamoring for permission to join their relatives in the United States," says a report just received by the London bureau of the Zionist organization from its special commissioner, Isidore Cohen. The question of re-uniting families, the bureau announces, has been presented to the state department at Washington.

At Lemberg, Mr. Cohen says, he made an inspection of the districts damaged during the pogroms and spoke with numerous victims as well as with Jewish representatives and with Colonel Wade of the British mission to Poland.

"There is abundant circumstantial evidence proving," his report continues, "that the pogrom was organized by the local military authorities who supplied machine-guns, hand grenades, automobiles and motor lorries. There are sworn protocols of 500 cases in which officer patrols took part and 2,000 cases in which ordinary soldiers took part. The names are known of eighteen officers and 72 soldiers who were guilty of participation in assaults and plunder.

"The Polish military command at Lemberg is making desperate efforts to obtain evidence of Jewish attacks on Polish soldiers as a justification for the pogrom. Members of the Jewish militia previously released for lack of any real charge were re-arrested and are still imprisoned by the order of the military commander, despite the decision of the examining judge that they should be liberated.

Damage done to personal property during the pogrom is estimated at 100,000,000 crowns. This does not include, however, the loss sustained by the destruction of synagogues. The Jewish committee in Lemberg had expended, up to the time of Mr. Cohen's report, 1,300,000 crowns on feeding, clothing and lodging 5,000 families.

"After my return from Lemberg," Mr. Cohen narrates, "I visited Cawlecim where a few days ago a band of rowdies attacked the Jews during worship in several houses of prayer. They broke the windows, tore up the books and also committed considerable damage in the Jewish cemetery, overturning and smashing tombstones. The Jews at Cawlecim pay 65,000 crowns monthly for the upkeep of the militia.

FIND BODIES OF NINE

VICKSBURG, Miss., March 19.—Searchers Monday continued examination of wreckage in the path of the tornado which Sunday swept eight miles from a point near Grace, 55 miles north of Vicksburg, northeast to Pantherburn. The bodies of one white man and eight negroes already have been found.
