

ALLIES MISSIONS PLAN ON LEAVING BUDAPEST

DISARMAMENT OF THE TROOPS IN
HUNGARY IS ALSO BEING CONSIDERED

Order Prevails So Far and No Violence Has Been Done to
Foreigners—Martial Law Is Declared and Death Pen-
alty Is Prescribed for Armed Resistance Against the
Bolshevik Government.

PARIS, March 25.—Unofficial reports from Budapest state that the allied missions there are debating the advisability of leaving and disarmament of French troops in the city is being considered.

Order prevails and no injury has yet been done to foreigners. Martial law is declared and the death penalty has been prescribed for armed resistance to the Bolsheviks and for robbery or looting.

Two British monitors reported on their arrival at Budapest having been under fire on the way up the Danube. Other British and French vessels are near.

Rumors that Hungary has declared war on Rumania, Czechoslovakia and Jugoslavia are said to be extremely doubtful.

PROGRESS ON AMENDMENTS

SIXTEEN SECTIONS TENTATIVELY
DISPOSED OF

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LENINE HAILS NEW ALLIANCE

COPENHAGEN, March 25.—Re-
ports of wireless exchanges between
Nikolai Lenin, the Bolshevik prem-
ier of Russia, and the foreign rep-
resentative of the new Hungarian com-
munist government are received in
advices from Budapest. Lenin
was told that the Hungarian pro-
letariat had seized power and had
introduced a proletarian dictatorship.
Greetings were sent to Lenin as
"leader of the international prole-
tariat." In greeting the Russian pro-
letariat, the new Hungarian govern-
ment expressed solidarity with the
revolutionary movement.

In his reply Lenin stated that he
had submitted the Hungarian greet-
ing to the Bolshevik congress at
Moscow, which had received it with
great enthusiasm. He added: "In
order to communicate between Mos-
cow and Budapest and report on the
military situation it is necessary to
maintain permanent wireless com-
munication between the two cities." He
concluded by extending "Bolshevik
greetings and a handshake."

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PROF. PRINCE HAS RESIGNED

OTHER OFFERS ATTRACT PRIN-
CIPAL FROM THIS CITY

Has Done Efficient Work in La
Grande Schools for the Past
Six Years.

Announcement was made today by
Prof. A. H. Prince that he had re-
signed his position as principal of the
Central school and will at the end of
the present school year locate else-
where. Two offers in the east and
one on the coast are attracting the
professor and have been the cause
of his decision to change his field of
labor. While he is not positively de-
termined which he will accept, indi-
cations are that he may go east into
a larger city.



It is a matter of regret to La
Grande people to know that this

extraordinary disciplinarian, which
fact is generally known among

His constant campaign against
tardiness has reduced the number to
a minimum, and his supervision of
the playgrounds has brought order
and discipline not only day but
every day. In fire drill work has a re-
cord in 41 seconds for clearing a
building containing 450 pupils. In
war work his attention was not di-
vided, for La Grande schools under
his supervision hit the 100 per cent
mark on food conservation pledges
and gained the remarkable record of
\$23 per capita for thrift stamps.

Wherever Prof. Prince and Mrs.
Prince shall locate the good wishes
of La Grande people, and especially
those who are patrons of the school,
will follow them.

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HUNS MAY YET NAME OWN TERMS

HUNGARIAN CRISIS IS LIKENED
TO THE RETURN OF NAPO-
LEON FROM ELBA.

FEARS EXPRESSED IN
ENGLAND AND FRANCE

Newspapers Generally Agree That
Procrastination in Reaching Conclu-
sion in Regard to Peace Is the Prime
Cause of Trouble in Hungary.

PARIS, March 25.—"The situation
is as serious as that which arose when
the congress of Vienna learned of Na-
poleon's return from Elba. Monday,
as a hundred years ago, negotiators
have provoked and have been sur-
prised by destiny," writes St. Brice
in the Journal.

"The problem before the council of
ten today is not the fate of the Ger-
man cables or the Teutonic commis-
sion, but the imperative necessity of
having Poland and Rumania rebuilt
the water-tight compartment which
has collapsed," he continues. "Other-
wise Germany, declaring herself alone
in a position to save western civiliza-
tion, will lay down her own peace
terms; instead of those the allies pro-
pose to dictate to her, or will threaten
to take the lead in the Bolshevik move-
ment."

This extract from an editorial ac-
curately reflects the views of the foreign
editors of French newspapers. They
generally agree in placing the prin-
cipal blame for the events on the pro-
crastination of the peace conference
and in insisting upon immediate steps
to fight Bolshevism.

Conditions Viewed Seriously.
LONDON, Via Montreal, March 24.
Hungary's adoption of Bolshevism is
regarded most seriously by the Anglo-
French press, which is endeavoring
the efforts of the entente to build up
the Rumanian, Polish and Czechoslo-
vak states as bulwarks against Ger-
man domination of central Europe.
All these three states are menaced by
advancing Bolshevik armies.

SIBERIAN ARE SUCCESSFUL
AGAINST THE BOLSHEVISTS

PARIS, March 25.—Siberian troops
of the Kolchak government success-
fully began an offensive west of the
Urals on a line from Perm to the
trans-Siberian railway, advices from
Omsk say. At certain points the Bol-
sheviki have been driven back more
than thirty miles. The Siberians have
captured Olanak, fifty miles south-
west of Perm.

On a fifty-mile front between
Olanak and Osa along the Kama river
the Bolsheviks have been driven back
twenty miles.

The Kolchak forces also are re-
ported to have obtained marked success
in the region of Bisk, northwest of Ufa.
