WILL CONSECRATE BISHOP OF BAKER

(By Associated Press to The Observer) Seattle, March 25.—Right Rev. Joseph F. McGrath, Tacoma, will be consecrated here Tuesday as bishop of the Baker, Ore., diocese. Dignitaries of the Roman Catholic church from many parts of the Pacific northwest will be present at the services.

Bishop-elect McGrath was nominated for the Baker diocese by Pope Benedict early in January, but the papal bull making the appointment did not arrive here until a few days ago.

Rev. McGrath will be installed as bishop of Baker April 1 at the cathedral of St. Francis de Sales. He will succeed Right Rev. Charles J. O'Reilly, who was appointed in April, 1918, to the Lincoln, Neb., diocese.

Of Irish birth, Bishop-elect McGrath was born in Ireland 47 years ago. After studying theology in Montreal he was ordained there in 1895 by Archbishop Fabre for the Springfield, Mass., diocese.

Later Father McGrath spent two years in missionary work among the Indians of northern Michigan. There he overtaxed his strength and went to Texas to rest. Later he came to Seattle and Tacoma.

UNUSUAL AND ATTRACTIVE WINDOW DISPLAY AT CARR'S

WILSON SHOWS CONCERN OVER THE PEACE TREATY

(By Associated Press to The Observer) PARIS, March 25.—President Wilson met Premier Clemenceau, Lloyd George and Orlando at the foreign office at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon for an hour a conference before the assembling of the supreme war council. Both the conference and the supreme war council were held amid a feeling of concern over the revolutionary developments in eastern Europe and the lack of definite results thus far reached in the Paris conference in stabilizing European conditions.

President Wilson was known to regard the situation as serious and as calling for energetic action toward hastening the work of the conference to completion and there was reason to believe that this would be one of the main subjects before both meetings, rather than the formal questions on the program.

ENGLAND SECURES ASYLUM FOR CHARLES OF AUSTRIA

COPENHAGEN, March 25.—The Vienna correspondent of the Berlin Voessische Zeitung says Colonel Strutt, who was stationed at Ekartan by the British government to watch the treatment accorded former Emperor Charles, had doubts as to the safety of the one time monarch and obtained the assent of Switzerland to grant him asylum without consulting Charles.

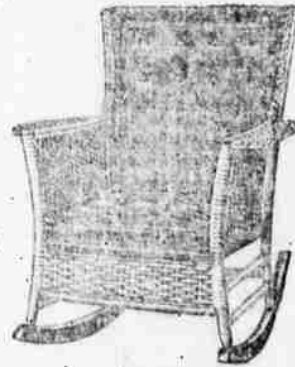
