WOULD HOLD ISLANDS

Japan's Attitude in Regard to Territory Taken From Germany.

TOKIO, March 2.—(By Mail)—Public opinion in Japan is not entirely unanimous on the question which, if Japan should obtain possession of the Marshall and Caroline Islands which she took from Germany and now holds. The Osaka Mainichi sets forth the attitude of many Japanese thinkers in an article in which that newspaper insists that the islands shall be retained. The Mainichi declares that, if America was allowed to seize and fortify Hawaii and thus to greatly threaten Japan; if she was permitted to occupy Guam and the Philippines, making them not only a source of wealth to herself but also a great menace to Japan, China and the British and Dutch possessions; if Australia and New Zealand have similar control over New Guinea and Samoa; it is certain that Japan shall possess the Marshall and Caroline Islands, exercising the same right and rule over them.

"And in so doing," the paper asserts, "Japan will be only setting the part of a small watch dog faithfully protecting its own house, in a very different manner and spirit from the American wolf whose wolfish ambition he indeed is to be feared. If Japan is not to be allowed to fortify the islands she took from Germany and which of right belongs to her, then the defense of Gibraltar, the Suez Canal and other points should be raised.

"Racial discriminatory treatment in these respects too, should be abolished and these islands not be left white man's domination."

The opposite view was expressed by Yukio Ozaki, former Minister of Justice, in an address delivered in Tokio a few days ago in which he said:

"It is indeed, a great honor for Japan to occupy the position of a stockholder in that great international corporation, the League of Nations. The honor is far greater than Japan will obtain by the possession of the Marshall and Caroline Islands."

COST OF CAMP TAYLOR

Heavy Expenditure on Hospital Work—Remarkable Rate of Recoveries.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., April 2.—Camp Zachary Taylor, the military city near here, up to the present time has cost the government \$9,189,999.06, according to a report by Captain Harlan Yenne, intelligence officer at the cantonment. The cost of constructing the cantonment approximated \$7,000,000 and more than \$2,000,000 has been expended in extra buildings, hospital wards, general reconstruction work and upkeep, the report said.

Since the signing of the armistice, Camp Taylor has aided in caring for wounded soldiers and has also been a demobilization center for men living in middle western states. The compilation shows that of the 47,796 soldiers who have passed through the Base Hospital only 1,297 have died, which is regarded by army officers as a remarkable record.

LION AND THE LAMB

Agreement Between Liquor and Prohibition Forces in Kentucky

LOUISVILLE, Ky., April 2.—Prohibition by agreement became effective today in Christian county, Ky. After an election on the prohibition question had been proposed, the liquor dealers, in view of the approach of national prohibition, consented to discontinue sale of liquor on April 1.

The effect of the novel experiment, which authorities say was never attempted before in America, will be watched with interest.

Under the agreement, the liquor dealers pledged themselves to aid in enforcing prohibition, and to use their influence against the issuance of new licenses by county authorities. If new applicants take action against county authorities to compel issuance of licenses, the old liquor dealers agree to bear fifty per cent of the cost of fighting such suits.

OREGON VICTORY LOAN

All Work Is to Be Done Under Systematic and Unified Direction.

PORTLAND, April 1.—Beginning with the third Liberty loan, a different method was adopted in Oregon than that used in other states for handling the work of the Liberty loan campaign. The plan organized and which will be employed in the Victory Loan provides an orderly method of listing, raising and collecting each individual Oregon's splendid record in the preceding Liberty loans indicates the efficiency of the system.

At the joint meeting of the county chairman of organizations of men and women in charge of the work throughout the state. It was unanimously decided that all solicitations will be done under this system and through unified direction. Work of both the women's and men's organizations will be co-ordinated in all promotional work. In parades, community sings, liberty loan rallies and similar activities, the work is naturally joined.

Securing of subscriptions is only the harvest. There can be no harvest without sowing and cultivation, which in liberty loan campaigns are represented in the promotional work, parades, advertisements, news and editorial articles in the newspapers, church rallies, theatre programs, four-minute talks and schoolhouse meetings. Since promotional work is so closely linked with soliciting and the organizations are joined in both, each will be credited with 50 per cent of the results.

Both organizations are working to a common end, and this decision at the joint meeting held at the Miltomah hotel, Friday, March 28, was one of the important conclusions of the conference.

County courts throughout the state will be asked to co-operate with the advertising fund committees appointed by county managers in each town and community. A representative of each newspaper will be appointed by the county manager to serve in an advisory relation to the advisory fund committee. These committees, composed of not less than three members, will canvass the business and professional men, merchants and others who should properly be contributors to the local advertising fund of the Victory Liberty loan. The collection of advertising funds will be undertaken immediately as the first order of business of county chairmen.

PLENTY OF PURE MOUNTAIN WATER NOW AVAILABLE
