HOME PEOPLE COMPLEMENTED**DIRECTOR ETHRIDGE PRAISES PATRIOTIC SPIRIT**

Tells Portland That Union County Quota is Ready in Minute.

It is Needed.

The Portland Telegram of Thursday has the following boost for Union county:

Definite terms of the coming Victory loan will not be announced before next Monday, according to advisers received this morning at Victory loan headquarters from Governor Lynch of the 12th federal reserve district. In his message Governor Lynch says the money market is easier, which is a forecast that there will be a ready demand for the bonds as soon as the drive is launched. There is considerable speculation throughout the country as to details of the loan, and not until the official announcement is made will Portland or any other city or town in the nation know how much its quota will be.

No matter what the quota is, Oregon will make it, is the opinion of the campaign directors. A fair sample of the feeling of the public was brought to Portland this morning by John L. Etheridge, director of the state organization, after a tour of Eastern Oregon.

"We'll go over the top at the crack of the starting gun," predicts Mr. Etheridge. "Not only that, but those human dynamo up in the Eastern Oregon country say that in La Grande and Union county they will pledge a total of \$600,000 the first day, clean up their work and then come to Portland to show us how it is done."

"There is no apathy, no pessimism, but a sublime willingness to clean up this new task and finish the job the way the Yankees boys finished it over in France. The up-state organization is in shape so that we could start the drive immediately and send it over with a momentum such as we have not had in any former drive. The people have the money and they are willing to invest it in our government securities."

"I want to tell the Portland campaign organization that they have got to go some if they want to keep anywhere in sight of our up-state bunch."

YEAR FOR ROAD BUILDING

Secretary Houston Sees Biggest Period in History.

Washington, D. C., April 2.—Many important steps have been taken to expedite road construction under the enlarged program recently authorized by congress, and the indications are that a larger volume of highway construction will be accomplished this season than in any previous year in the history of the nation, according to a statement issued by David F. Houston, secretary of agriculture today. The requisite official machinery, says the secretary, for executing this program—that is, the department of agriculture, through the Bureau of Public Roads on the one hand, and the forty-eight state highway departments on the other—is already in existence. A conference was held by the secretary on March 1 with the state highway commissioners of the eastern and middle western states and all phases of the problem, and especially the interpretation of the liberal amendments of the Federal Aid Road Act, were considered. The regulations issued under the act have been carefully revised in the light of past experiences and of the suggestions offered by the state highway departments, the standards for plans, specifications, and estimates have been modified to meet special conditions existing in some of the states, and other changes in practices and procedure have been made and are being made—all with the definite object of speeding up the work. The appointment of Thomas H. MacDonald, Chief Engineer of the Iowa State Highway Commission, as Engineer in immediate charge of the work of the Bureau of Public Roads under the Federal Aid Road Act, has just been announced by the secretary, and it is planned that, in the near future, Mr. MacDonald will formally assume the position of director of the Bureau of Public Roads.

WILL TAKE UP FATHER'S WORK

Col. Roosevelt to Take Over Business to Give Time to Public Life.

NEW YORK, April 2.—Lieut. Col. Theodore Roosevelt, who has been designated by Republican party leaders in the city as a possible candidate for president of the board of aldermen next fall, announced today that he intended to follow the footsteps of his father and enter politics.

He declined to state, however, whether the statement bore any weight acceptable to him in case he received a formal invitation to run for that office, asserting that it was too soon for him to set his initial goal. He added that his announcement meant that "that was in the wind" because he intended to retire from business and consider some explanation necessary. His present activities, he said, were confined to a organization in the country of the World War Veterans' association.

In making known his intention to retire from business, Lieut. Col. Roosevelt said he desired to devote himself "to public life," by which he said he meant "entering politics."

Wants to Work in Own State
"They depend on what the public wishes me to do. I naturally am anxious to do what work I may be called upon to do in my own state—in the state in which my father was born, where I was born and where we have always lived. Beyond that I don't see what I can say."

"I believe strongly in the principles advocated by my father. I believe strongly in the principle of universal military service. And I believe strongly in unlimited nationalism."

The business from which Col. Roosevelt purposes to retire is banking.

WOULD HAVE CHATEAU WHERE HUSBAND FELL
