OLDEST MAN IN STATE

Death in Idaho of Russell Newman, Born in 1811

BOISE, Idaho, April 8.—Russell Newman, perhaps the oldest man in Idaho and said to be the oldest Oddfellow in the United States, is dead at the home of his son in Midvale. Mr. Newman had been a resident of Weiser, Idaho, for a number of years and up until within two weeks ago enjoyed good health.

Mr. Newman was born in Kentucky, March 29, 1811, and was a pioneer in Missouri, Colorado and Idaho.
