SPORTSMEN WANT REMOVAL OF STATE GAME WARDEN

The Oregon Sportsmen's League, who is trying to secure the removal of Carl D. Shoemaker from the office of state game warden, has approached local sportsmen, through the Wing, Fin and Fleetfoot Club, for their support of the endeavor. An appeal issued by the League states that political and commercial interests have made a tool of the state game warden and that, Mr. Shoemaker has made use of money from the state game, protective fund for his expenses in connection with work he has done to secure the election of his political candidate.

Al Andrews, secretary of the Wing, Fin and Fleetfoot Club, says that while local sportsmen are well satisfied with the game warden's work in the protection of game, they have a protest to register against the manner in which he handles matters of propagation of game. It is in respect to this phase of his work that the allegation is made that he is controlled by commercial interests. Instead of the streams of the state being planted with real game fish, steelheads have been planted, it is said, and the steelheads promptly went down to the ocean and became lost for the canners.

Local sportsmen have long been working to get the streams of this part of the state restocked with trout, but the exception of a few runs all they ever received have been steelheads.

Something of this may come up when the fish and game commission hold their meeting in Portland Friday this week. Governor Olson has invited Mr. Andrews to attend this meeting and to have another representative there, also, so it is expected that the Wing, Fin and Fleetfoot members and other representative sportsmen will have their say out Friday morning.

Alaska Copper Makes Big Part of Her Exports in the Month of February

JENEAU, Alaska, March 16.—(By Mail)—Four-fifths of Alaska's exports during the month of February were copper, valued at \$1,805,567, according to the report of the collector of customs. Total exports were valued at \$1,822,781. From the copper ore, palladium valued at \$10,000 was shipped. Platinum exports were valued at \$1,050.

Gold and silver exports during the same month from Alaska were valued at \$176,002, the silver portion being \$50,353.
