GREEK REFUGES HAD HARD TIME

CORRESPONDENT VISIT SETTLEMENT NEAR SALONIKI

Five Years of Fleeing Before Turks and Bulgars Writes Story in Faces.

SALONIKI (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—High up on the hills of this bustling Macedonian city is a picturesque settlement where 2,000 Greek refugees, driven from Asia Minor by the massacres of 1914, make their homes. Hundreds of other Greeks who were interned by the Bulgarians in Dobruja during the war have joined them recently. The houses in this refugee camp were constructed by the Greek government. A space equivalent to a large New York furnished room is allotted to a family of from five to eight.

The settlement has been given the pretentious name of "The Quarter of the Triumvirate," in honor of Greece's three great modern patriots—Premier Venizelos, Admiral Kountouriotis and General Dangliah who, repudiating King Constantine, espoused the cause of the Allies when Germany sought to win over the Greek army. Many of the people have been helped by the American Red Cross and speak gratefully of the United States and its people.

As the Associated Press correspondent was visiting the village, two ox-carts loaded with Greek refugees who had been driven by the Turks from the villages along the Sea of Marmora in 1913 and 1914 and who during the present war were expelled from Macedonia by the Bulgars, made their way slowly up the steep mountain road. The refugees had just come from Dobruja, to the south of Rumania, where they were practically exterminated by the Bulgars. U-BOATS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE HERE LATE THIS MONTH

WASHINGTON, April 17.—The five German submarines now en route across the Atlantic will go first to New York. This announcement was made recently by the navy department. An itinerary has been worked out for each of the five U-boats. The UB-145 will be exhibited at various places in and about New York, then proceed up the Hudson river as far as her draft will safely permit. Afterward she will proceed to Bridgeport, Conn., and later will lie up at New London.

The UC-97 will go from New York to Halifax, up the St. Lawrence river, exhibit in lake ports and finally lie up at the naval training station at Great Lakes, Ill.

Of the other three German submarines, the U-111 will proceed from New York to Portland, Me.; Portsmouth, N. H.; Boston, Newport, Providence, New Haven, and lie up at New London.

The two remaining submarines will cruise southward from New York. The U-117 will go to Philadelphia, Wilmington, Del.; Charleston, S. C.; Wilmington, N. C.; Norfolk, Baltimore, Annapolis, and lie up at Washington. The UB-88 will go from New York to Savannah, thence to Jacksonville, Tampa, Pensacola, Mobile, up the Mississippi river to St. Louis, and thence to Galveston, Key West, through the Panama Canal, up the Pacific Coast to the Puget Sound district, finally lying up at San Pedro, Cal.

No specific date has been set for the arrival of the submarines at New York. They are expected in some time between April 29 and 30.

STRIKE SPREADS TO ITALY.

Socialists and Opponents Clash and Four Persons Killed in Fight.

MILAN, Italy, April 18.—Four persons were killed and several wounded during disorders here Wednesday incident to clashes between Socialist and anti-Socialist groups. The offices of the Socialist newspaper Avanti were wrecked in the fighting. The workmen of Milan, Bologna, Turin and Genoa, the principal manufacturing cities of northern Italy, began a 24-hour strike Thursday.

SEVERE SEISMIC DISTURBANCE RECORDED BY SEISMOGRAPH

WASHINGTON, April 18.—An earthquake of unusual severity was recorded late Thursday by the seismograph at Georgetown university. The earth tremors were first recorded at 4:59 and lasted until 6:19, reaching the point highest intensity at 5:19. It was estimated that the disturbance was located approximately 2,000 miles from Washington and probably in Central or South America.

BERLIN, Railroad communication between Berlin and Munich has ceased. Bamberg, which is still the seat of the Hofmann government, also is cut off from Munich. EUROPE INSISTS ON HAVING THE TREATY WRITTEN BY HAND

PARIS, April 18.—President Wilson has shot Europe's diplomatic customs and systems to pieces, but there is one old tradition that survives—the peace treaty being written by hand. The president business-like leaps to the typewriter in Washington whenever he had a note to send made no impression upon chancelleries of Europe. Custom has it that all treaties and conventions must be handwritten, so the greatest of all treaties is being committed to paper with pen and ink.

Joseph Coris of the French ministry of foreign affairs has been entrusted with the historic task of writing out the treaty. Besides holding the post of official calligrapher he is also a talented painter. He is not only writes treaties at conventions, but also all of the official documents conferring orders or decorations on sovereigns and all of the letters which are sent to them and signed either by the president of the republic or by ministers.

The document, when completed, will be beautifully illuminated. For the text, roundhand is being used, for the headings, stately Gothic characters. Despite the care taken by M. Coris it is said, however, that this document will not compare with the treaty of Vienna as an art document.

The congress of Vienna, at which were assembled many emperors, kings, queens and hereditary princes, had a painter, specially charged not only to write, but to draw and illuminate after the fashion of the old Missals, the capital letters and headings. Between each item of the treaty signatures, emblems, crests and all sorts of symbols were drawn. Miniature portraits of the chief personalities adorned the margins of the mighty document.

TAX RESPONSE IS PROMPT

LOUISVILLE, Ky., April 17.—More than \$1,100,000.00 has been collected as the first installment of tax payments, due one month ago. It was collected by Internal Revenue Commissioner Rorer in an address yesterday before the Southern Wholesale Drygoods Association. The fact that this was done within 17 days after the president had signed the revenue bill, and largely on the basis of tentative returns, Mr. Rorer said, demonstrated that the American people co-operated willingly in gathering their own taxes, instead of leaving the government to press for payment.

GOVERNOR HARDING

CHARGES CONSPIRACY

In Statement After Vote of Censure He Alleges Political Enmity

DES MOINES, Ia., April 18.—Iowa's house of representatives ended its investigation of the Rathbun case at noon Thursday by criticizing Attorney General H. M. Hayner for his activities in the case, after censuring Governor W. L. Harding Wednesday night for his connection with the affair.

Governor Harding, confined to his bed with diabetes, seriously ill, heard the verdict of the house within a few minutes and almost immediately gave the following statement to the Associated Press:

"I am pleased over the result of the vote in the house. No man in Iowa has had to submit to more severe political persecution than have I. My enemies are well known. Their hand is not covered and sooner or later their conspiracy will be laid bare to the people of Iowa."

When the record in this conspiracy is finally made, the governor continued, the name of a Des Moines newspaper publisher "will stand as the chief conspirator."
