### PURPOSES OF AN ALL-RUSS GOVERNMENT

Can See Certain Signs With Continuance of Bolshevik Element in Power

QMSK, Siberia, (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—Admiral Kolchak, head of the all-Russian government, speaking recently in Ekaterinburg before a conference of members of the Duma, "zemstvos and other organizations," reiterated his belief in democracy for Russia, declaring it to be "the only" admissible form of future government.

Rolshchikov, he said, is destroying the very foundation of authority in the country and means a desperate struggle for a long time.

At present, he pointed out, conditions sometimes force the government to employ means which do not correspond with principles of democracy, but he assured his hearers that such measures were temporary and that steps were being taken to insure universal suffrage, labor and land legislation and to develop organs of self-government.

"The government endeavors to maintain and strengthen friendly relations with the Allies," said the dictator. "Russia was alarmed by the invitation to send her delegates to Prince's Islands to negotiate with Bolsheviks. Now this question is settled. The statesmen of western Europe now see the truth and blame the Bolsheviks, calling them murderers and terrorists, as did Lloyd George."

"The government is inspired with the ideal of restoring the motherland. It is not called upon to settle all fundamental questions. The Russian people is master of its fate. Released from the yoke of Bolshevism it will, through its representatives in a national assembly, express its will in regard to its form of government and its social structure. Then the present government will transfer its power to such an authorized government."

### "WANTED TO GO UP"

Men Billed at Air Stations Find Time for Diversion

WITH THE AMERICAN ARMIES IN FRANCE, (Correspondent of Associated Press)—An infantry colonel whose station had served to keep him clear of airplanes was recently billed very near to an American army air station. Taking a stroll about the grounds he came to an improvised desk near headquarters. A sign above the desk read:

"All officers who want to go up must register."

The colonel eagerly seized a pencil chained to the desk for the registering officers. The pencil was made of metal. The colonel slipped high in the air. He got all the thrills of a real flight.

Two lieutenants and an enlisted man apparently attending to some repairs but really gawking developments chuckled silently. The colonel thinking himself apprehended was consoled by the later antics of a major who also desired to fly.

## State News

Two hundred and fifteen miles of road work soon will be under way in Eastern Oregon.

Pilot Rock has voted to bond the district for \$35,000 to erect a new high school building.

Ray Mates, employed by the A. F. Coats Lumber company, was drowned at Tillamook Saturday.

Spanish influenza has struck Pilot Rock the second time. Schools have been closed for two weeks.

J. W. Brewer, for more than a year farm help specialist in Oregon, has tendered his resignation.

Work will soon begin on a new \$100,000 hotel at Gearheart to replace the one burned three years ago.

Mr. and Mrs. G. Schwark of Oregon City have just received word that their son Henry was killed in action in France.

The local Masonic order at Homestead has purchased three lots and plans to erect a two-story building in the near future.

Tuesday's casualty list contained the name of H. Windhill, Toledo, Or., died. It is generally understood the casualty occurred in Siberia.

A fine granite quarry, suitable for monuments, has been discovered at Roderick Falls, five miles west of Forest Grove.

Homer G. Tasker, a graduate of Willamette university, has been recommended as an assistant in physics at the University of California.

Thornton Umphrey, discharged soldier, was instantly killed Sunday night when he came in contact with high voltage wires while trying to walk the girder of the bridge between Eugene and Springfield.

Early tourist travel, noticed by hotels of Pacific Northwest cities, is due in large extent to advertising by the Pacific Northwest Tourist association run recently in Los Angeles and other California papers inviting Eastern tourists who spent winter months in California to return by way of the Pacific Northwest, according to hotel managers.

The grain corporation of the local administration has received official confirmation of the recent assignment of two more steel ships for flour carriers. The ships are the West Hargrave and the West Cherow, Portland-built vessels, which will be operated by the Pacific Steamship company. Additional assignment of steel vessels are expected in a few days, to meet the four shipping needs of the administration.

### MEXICAN TROOP TRAINS

JUAREZ, Mex., April 22.—American soldiers in France who rode in stock cars marked for thirty men or 15 horses had the best of it compared to the Mexican federal soldier when traveling on troop trains in campaign. Cavalry horses are given the preference over the soldiers who are forced to ride on top of the stock cars with their families huddled under crudely improvised tents made from scraps of canvas or pieces of tin. The usual way of loading troop trains is to put the horses in the cars, the soldiers and their families on top and the impediments under the car strapped to the brace rods. Women and children even ride under the cars on these brace rods.

The make-up of a Mexican troop train is: Locomotive, tender, armored cars with machine guns, stock cars with soldiers, their families and cavalry horses; flat car with a steel turret containing a revolving mountain gun, caissons for the use of the train crew, private cars for the staff officers and the private car of the commanding general at the rear end.

### IDENTIFIED AS HERRING

SEATTLE, Wash., April 22.—After considerable research, Prof. Trevor Kincaid, department of zoology, University of Washington, has identified the so-called Puget Sound pilchard fish as plain herring. State Fish Commissioner L. H. Darwin has been much concerned over the identity of the "pilchard" since Austrian purse seiners began destroying them in great numbers in the point Discovery district recently.

### THREE WOUNDED IN BATTLE

GLENN'S FERRY, Ill., April 22.—Charles Sumner, city marshal of Glenn's Ferry, is lying seriously wounded in a Boise hospital. Great Gage, Oregon Short Line waterman, also of Glenn's Ferry, has a shattered left hand and a bullet grazed above the ear; E. L. Little, a negro hauling from Pocatello, is in a Mountain Home hospital, shot through the head and right arm, and Charles Edwards, another negro, is in the Elmore county jail at Mountain Home as the result of an affray at Glenn's Ferry Monday afternoon.

The officers were attempting to arrest the negroes who were suspected by robbery.
