Signs That Bolshevism Is Breaking Down.

The news reports of the past few days have been somewhat encouraging in the direction that the Russian Bolsheviki forces are being driven back.

In his recent speech before the house of commons, Premier Lloyd George declared that while the Bolshevist armed force was apparently growing stronger, Bolshevism itself was gradually waning and breaking down before the relentless force of economic facts.

The Bolsheviki have undertaken to operate a nation's industries without capital, and without the managerial ability trained under the old system.

Lenine and Trotsky have tried to make things go by pouring into industry public funds obtained by confiscation or consisting of fiat money.

The workers, in whose behalf the Bolshevist regime is supposed to be operating, seem to sense the absurdity of it.

So Lloyd George is right. It is not necessary to fight Bolshevism by the force of arms.
