"THE CAVELL CASE" THE WOMAN THE GERMAN SOLDIER

She had received a letter from her former sweetheart, who has since married, asking her to try and find his son, who has been listed among the missing. She finally finds him and determines to aid him to escape. That night he reaches the Holland border. Edith Cavell is discovered and imprisoned. She confesses to having aided many English boys to escape from the cellar of fifth and postoffice where the Germans forced them to remain. She is ordered to be shot and at two o'clock in the morning of October 2, 1915, Edith Cavell was placed against a stone wall and became a target for the guns of the German soldiers.

THEDA BARA SPEAKS SCENES IN ACTING

Contrary to popular belief, Theda Bara, who is appearing in her latest super-production, "When a Woman Sins," at the Sherry theatre, has a wonderful speaking voice, which she uses while playing before the camera. R. N. Stanfield personally underwrote Malheur county's quota for the Victory loan.

Continued heavy rains of the past week have damaged the onion crop in the Beaverton district.

Gritman brothers are erecting a \$20,000 apartment house on the corner of Webb and Willow streets in Pendleton.

J. R. Carson of Hood River has been elected to the grand master's post of the grand council of Royal and Select Masons of Oregon.

A. C. Rose has resigned as county roadmaster of Clatsop county to accept a position with the federal road department.

Mrs. Celia Gurdan, a pioneer resident of Umatilla county, and well known throughout Eastern Oregon, is dead at Pendleton, aged 78 years.

Among the admiring throngs which will greet the arrival of the historic battleships Oregon next Sunday, will be John McPherson, foreman of the driving forces at the Northwest Steel company, who has the honor of driving the first rivet into the famous sea fighter, when the vessel was under construction at the Union Iron works at San Francisco, January 14.

No lower farm wages this year are in sight, contends J. W. Kravon, J. A. C. and Federal farm hand specialist for Oregon. He has returned from visiting so far as this was any prospect that readjustment in living costs might operate to lower labor wages. Rock bottom wages in Western Oregon are \$50 a month and board, and in Eastern Oregon, \$60 a month and board. The call for many horse teamsters on the wheat ranches is growing, with offers of \$50 to \$75 per month.
