Record of the Rainbow Division.

The Observer has published several of the letters from the members of the 42nd division (Rainbow) in which high praise was bestowed upon these fighters. Now, that the division is returning to the United States, it is not out of place to again present a brief review of what this division accomplished toward the downfall of Prussianism.

The division was cited ten times by the French and six times by the American commanders under whom it served. It participated in every major operation of the American army and received letters of commendation in each case.
