NOTED PREACHER HERE THURSDAY

DR. H. W. LEWIS TO SPEAK IN METHODIST CHURCH

Comes As Special Centenary Speaker To Explain Purpose of Evangelization Movement.



H. W. Lewis, one of the men who have organized 75,000 Methodist five-minute men in America within a few months, will speak at the First Methodist Episcopal church in La Grande Thursday, at 8 p. m.

Dr. Lewis is one of the notable figures in Methodism. When only a young preacher, earning \$750 a year, he was offered a salary of \$5,000 a year to manage a large and successful firm. Even when he was a student in college, a business man offered to finance him and divide profits.

Texas nominated him for governor but he was defeated. As a preacher, he has filled some of the best known Methodist churches in the country and everywhere commands the highest respect among business men as well as with those with whom he is associated in church work.
