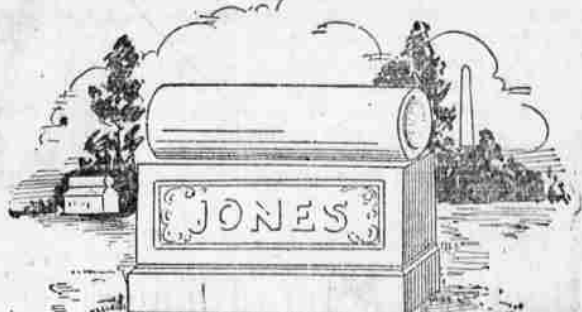

CHURCH ENTERS LABOR FIELD

WILL DEVOTE SUNDAY TO EMPLOYMENT PROBLEMS

Methodist Minute Men To Help Find Positions for Returned Soldiers and Sailors.

The Methodist Minute Men, seventy-five thousand strong, will devote Sunday, May 4, for the purpose of finding employment for the returned soldiers. Every layman who can possibly do it will be urged to open positions at once for returned soldiers. The Minute Men will also have charge of listing positions in the local employment bureau, the United States employment bureau and the Y. M. C. A. bureau. If there is no such bureau, then with the State Bureau or with the Washington office. The local church is to take the initiative to form in every community an employment bureau to cooperate with the federal employment service.

Every church is to have a committee on employment and demobilization to see how many of the soldiers of the local congregation have positions awaiting them, and endeavor to open positions for the others who do not seem to have such positions, and to prepare for the reception of returned soldiers to that congregation. This is a nation-wide movement to help out in the present crisis on the part of the Methodist Episcopal church.

If any one doubts that a new day is dawning upon the world and upon the church and that the church is entering heartily into the business of making the world a better place, he should study the new policy of the church in establishing goodwill in industrial centers. These institutions recruit human wreckage, the unfor-

lunate, the handicapped, from the slums and poorest sections of cities and give them a work to help themselves in a self-respecting way. This is not charity. It is common sense and real vital Christianity.

Morgan Memorial Methodist Episcopal church in Boston has the oldest and most fully developed work with industry. This parent enterprise comprises two large buildings, six stories high, with 8,000 square feet to a floor. Good will bags, made of unbleached cotton are distributed to well-to-do people throughout the city, who fill them with cast off clothing, shoes and almost anything else they want to get rid of. Broken furniture, household appliances and all sorts of damaged domestic equipment furnish the "raw material" for the industry.

All articles, on their receipt at the good will buildings, are first fumigated, then sorted out, then assigned to the different repairing departments, where they are soon made "as good as new." During the year 1916, more than 100,000 garments were repaired, 500,000 pieces of furniture and 50,000 pairs of shoes. More than \$24,000 was paid out in wages, and more than 5,000 destitute people found temporary decent employment to tide them over hard times.

A regular staff of 125 workers are employed as clerks in the various workshops, and also as chauffeurs and bookkeepers. A school of handicraft has been developed for the benefit of those who know no trade and have no skill in any line of work when they first come to the establishment. The industries are not run for profit. All income goes in to equipment, wages, training of the workers, and toward the relief of the poor.

The installation and maintenance of this chain of thirty-two of these centers is a part of the Centenary World Program of the Methodist Episcopal church. Of the \$105,000,000 to be raised in the Missionary Centenary Campaign, which extends from May 18 to 25, the sum of \$285,000 will be set aside and invested in the good will industries

now in process of organization for Los Angeles, St. Louis, Cincinnati, Denver, Brooklyn, Philadelphia, Chicago, Buffalo and Pittsburgh. It is expected to put them into thirty cities.

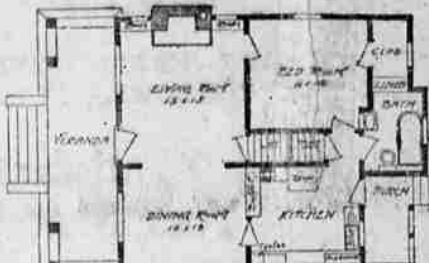
