AD. SANTEL WAS THE WINNER

TWO STRAIGHT BY THE ARM SCISSORS ROUTE

Pronounced a Clean Contest and a Fast Exhibition by Large Crowd in Attendance

In one hour and forty minutes of some of the fastest wrestling ever seen in the intermountain country, Ad Santel, champion light heavyweight wrestler of the world, beat Nick De Court of Los Angeles in two straight falls at the Arcade theatre last night.

The match was a thriller and never perhaps in the history of the game have two men shown speed and at the same time displayed truer sportsmanship. They agreed that in the judgment of the referee they were so far off the mat they were to come back to the center at his command, and this they did in every instance without any argument.

The first fall went 76 minutes, and after Santel had gotten one of his celebrated arm scissors which had been repeatedly broken by the younger man, he clamped it on for a final squeeze which caused De Court to concede the fall. It was De Court's lion heart that made him try to defy the inevitable, resulting in such injury to his arm that he was really unfit to return for the second fall but he did, nevertheless. In the second fall Santel won in 24 minutes by the same hold that gave him the first.

Many thought it would be Nick's match because for the first hour of the go he rode Ad to a finish and showed everything. Both men in fact had "everything" and it was only a case of "bricks" that defeated De Court for these men are so evenly matched that it's a "horse race," whenever they start.

Edward D. Rosenheim of Boise,

who writes sports for the Evening Capital News under the name of "The Grub," refereed the main go and had no difficulty in handling his men. He complimented La Grande's fans on their clean sportsmanship saying that never in his 25 years' experience had he witnessed a cleaner bit of rooting for the respective favorites. Mr. Rosenheim came to write the match for Idaho not to judge it, but did as the result of a rather insistent demand that he be the third man in the ring. He left this morning for his home. He predicts a world's heavyweight championship for De Court barring accidents, within the next two years.

Oregon school children will have a chance to save the battleship Oregon from the junk pile, if a plan presented to Mayor Baker of Portland by Monroe Goldstein, assistant to the selective draft executive of Oregon, is accepted. The plan which has been approved by the mayor, is to ask every pupil in every school in the state to contribute a penny a week to a fund to be known as the "save the Oregon fund."

Pendleton, instead of the nine months school session which has been the rule heretofore, will have 10 months of school, next year, according to a decision reached Saturday night at a meeting of the school board. This applies to both grammar and high school in the city.
