As long as the credit and delivery systems are maintained by so many of our people, it is going to be impossible to get the necessities of life down to as low a price as they should be. In my judgment, **THERE IS AN ARTIFICIAL COST PLACED UPON NECESSITIES BY THE UNNECESSARY CREDIT SYSTEM.** I presume I would not be far off the way if I would estimate the losses of the retail dealers in food products at 10 per cent. This naturally has to be spread over all sales, making the **CASH CUSTOMERS** Carry the Bill.

## MEMORIAL DAY SUNDAY

COPY OF OREGON MEMORIAL ANNUAL RECEIVED

State School Superintendent Thinks Every Community Should Fittingly Recognize Day

Mrs. A. E. Ivanhoe, county superintendent of schools, has recently received a copy of the Oregon Memorial Annual for 1919, issued by State School Superintendent Churchill. It is full of good suggestions for teachers and also contains a number of fine articles of appropriate character that the general public might read with interest. There are included a number of fine old poems, such as "The Battle Hymn of the Republic," "In Flanders Fields," "The Flag Goes By," and others.

Superintendent Churchill has an important message to the teachers printed on the first page of the booklet. It is as follows:

"Memorial day this year has a wider meaning than it ever had before. Sacred as the day has been in our national life because of the sacrifices of those who have given their lives for the establishment of the principles of liberty and justice in our beloved land, this year its meaning has been broadened and enriched by our participation in the war. Along with our own soldiers, men of other nations have fought and died that these principles might be estimated throughout the whole world.

"It is fitting, then, that in our observance of memorial day this year we give thought to its widened scope, and that we render tribute to the memory of that vast multitude of men of all the nations who in the recent war made the supreme sacrifice as soldiers of the army of the right.

"With this added weighty reason for the observance of memorial day, no community should let the day pass without fitting recognition. And I can recognize no recognition more fitting than the formal observance of it in the school room. In our schools lies the hope of the nation. There is no problem before us as a nation today but needs for its successful background of knowledge and of ideals. It is eminently right that the school should be the first to take advantage of this opportunity to inculcate, in old and young alike, ideas of true citizenship and true patriotism.

"There is a wealth of material for a program this year. That given in the pamphlet is but a portion of what is available and is intended to be suggestive merely. It ought to be possible for every school to have the best memorial day program this year it ever had."
