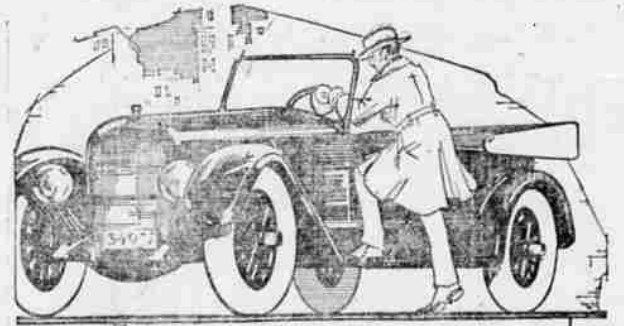

amount to a freight rate of \$1.12 as against the previous rate of fifty cents, and would compel the shipper to discontinue shipments of such chain wood into La Grande for sale as fuel, as to ship would entail a loss, or adopt the alternative of raising the retail price, and

Where as, the situation can be remedied by the railroad administration making an exception to its recent order, and restoring the previous order as an exception thereto. Now therefore,

Be it resolved by the Union County Ad Club that we endorse the efforts of Mr. Lounsbury, the general freight agent having the matter in charge, and of the Public Service Commission of Oregon, to have the old rate and order restored as an exception, and very respectfully and earnestly request such action from the railroad administration.
