Y. M. C. A. COURSE IN SWIMMING

Every girl and boy in La Grande should be taught to swim this summer. The Y. M. C. A. of this city is giving that opportunity to every man, woman and child for four months, June July, August and September, at a nominal membership rate. Each person who joins will be given instruction in the classes and also private lessons if desired. The membership which the Y. M. C. A. is offering so reasonably at this time does not only include the swimming lessons, the shower baths and the other numerous privileges of the Association, but it permits each person to take advantage of the gymnasium work which is given prior to the swimming lesson.

The plunge at the Y. M. C. A. always has fresh water running into it, thus insuring the best sanitary conditions. Besides this, the tank is emptied of all water each Saturday night and scrubbed out, for there is bound to be some sediment in the bottom of every tank. The tank is filled again and ready for use Monday evening. The plunge has recently been replenished and is in splendid condition and the water is never so cold but one can stay in without his teeth chattering.

In order to maintain cleanliness in the tank every person must take a shower bath before entering the water. The best time to swim is just before meal time or about two hours following any meal. The majority of persons get cramps by going in too soon after a hearty repast. Man is one of the few animals who must be taught to swim. He cannot jump into the water for the first time and swim without previous coaching and effort on his part. The instinct to swim is not there. He usually loses his head completely and begins to yell for help if he is not a swimmer. In an emergency if a man does not swim he drowns and if others about him are drowning he is helpless.

The first secret in mastering the art of swimming is to drive fear of the water out of one's mind. If one can forget fright when one enters the water for the first time the battle to become a swimmer is half won. Confidence in one's self to learn is another requisite which the neophyte must master. With fright eliminated and confidence established the beginner is soon swimming all strokes and diving with ease.

In a class of several ladies last week at the Y. M. C. A. one of the students lacked confidence in herself. She swam a few feet, but

could not swim where it was over her head. Being urged by the instructor to swim with him to the other end of the tank where the water was nine feet deep, she started out and at each stroke she gained confidence in herself and the next time she swam the same distance she proved "it could be done." Her progress from now on will be marvelous.

Seniors (18 to 25) Wednesday evening 7:30 to 9:30 and any other time during the day when another class is not scheduled.

Business men (over 25) Monday and Thursday 5:30 to 6:30 and any other time another class is not in session.

Girls (over 12) Tuesday and Friday afternoons 4:30 to 5:30.

mission room in the city building in La Grande, Oregon, and hear and determine all objections, remonstrances and claims of relevance of any person interested.

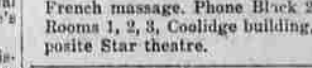
