tion of a local building and loan association. The plan is an organization being worked up, he said, but it has not fully materialized yet.

Wants Support for New School
In Hampton, city superintendent of schools, urged the Ad Club to lend its whole support in the June elections to the proposition for the erection of a new school building for the housing of the manual training and the mechanical department. The school attendance has outgrown the accommodations at present available, he said, and the building of a brick structure, 100 x 50 feet, at the rear of the high school building, will be placed on the ballot in June. The board of education intends placing instruction in gas operation on the course of study next year and this, Mr. Hampton said, will result in a largely increased attendance.

Uniforms for Ball Team
The announcement of the chairman that the baseball nine was in need of uniforms and that four merchants in this city had already agreed to pay for one suit each, with the privilege in return of placing their ad upon it, immediately brought offers from eleven other business men present to duplicate their orders.

Sergt. Harding Talks
A brief address by Geo. T. Cochran preceded Sergt. Chas. Harding's talk. Mr. Cochran said in effect that with the boys now home the Ad Club would be called upon to make good its promise that it would secure for them their old jobs, or if wanted better ones to see that they got them. Mr. Harding, who arrived in town only this morning, was the only one of several returned men who had been invited to put in an appearance. He received a very enthusiastic reception from the members of the Club. He voiced briefly his pleasure at being home and remarked upon the evident spirit of co-operation now existing among the business men of the city.

His talk concluded the program and announcing that Bishop Pad dock would be the guest of the club at their luncheon next Tuesday, and appointing Chas. Bohnenkamp chairman for that day, Chairman man Embisher, ordered adjournment.

Advertising Is on New Mr. Rosenblatt Declares

"Newspaper advertising is the best form of advertising for any retail merchant. Advertising in the newspapers pays better this year than it ever did before. Old associates and old friends as well as new ones, were broken by the war, and this is the era of the new deal. The merchant who realizes this is the merchant who is forging ahead in 1919. He is doing so by the aid of the newspapers."

These are the declarations that Samuel Rosenblatt, brought back from Chicago, where he had gone to place orders for merchandise for the big fall trade which he sees assured.

He had an opportunity to meet a number of the largest merchants in the country. They all agreed with him, he said, that this year in the year always all others to advertise. "They don't know what has brought out the season of advertising so prominently," he said. "It may be the fact that the government, to float its loans and carry out the work of the food administration and things like that, used advertising so extensively and taught business men what really could be done by advertising in a big broad way. 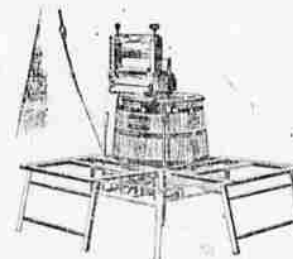
