RUSSIAN FINANCES GROWING WORSE

The Menshevik, the Moderate Party, Protests Against the Bolshevik.

LONDON. (Correspondence of the Associated Press.)—The Bolshevik government of Russia reported to be least by grave internal troubles, especially in North Russia. Details regarding the situation for among men in that district has been published recently by local dispatch stations against the Soviet authorities, by strikes and sabotage.

The Bolshevik financial position is rapidly growing worse. Reports submitted by Krasniaki, commissary for finance, for the second half of 1918, show a deficit owing to the fact that the "single tax on the post office classes," which was estimated to yield 10,000,000,000 rubles, yielded only 450,000,000 as the townspeople of the "possessing class" were financially exhausted and the peasants offered armed resistance to forced payment.

A large wing of the Menshevik, or moderate party has refused to adhere to the Bolshevik and adopted the following program:

Opposition to Bolshevik rule, which is declared to have "resulted in chaos and the destruction of national life in Russia."

Revival of capitalism on democratic lines as being the only means of restoring Russian industry and commerce with the outside world.

The convening of a constituent assembly, to be elected by general franchise.

Restoration of the frontiers of Russia, exclusive of Poland and Finland, with a grant of local political autonomy and a federative uniting such territories as desire independence.

States control of industry, as opposed to workman's control.

BELGIUM'S AVIATOR KING.

BRUSSELS, May 20.—The arrival of the King of the Belgians in Paris to present the case of Belgium before the peace conference created great interest in Paris. The fact that the king made the journey from his capital to that of the French republic by air route made his arrival more spectacular.

Few know that the king had originally intended to go to London that morning but changed his mind at the last moment. "Combez, the young Belgian millionaire aviator, who pilots him in all of his air travels, told the Associated Press that his motor was running, his propeller just gathering speed, when he was informed by the king that Paris and not London was to be their objective on that particular trip.

DISTRUST WILSON'S IDEALS OMSK, May 7.—(By Mail.)—The all Russian government here, through M. Soukine, the acting foreign minister, has requested Maj. Gen. Graves, American commander in Siberia, not to send American troops farther into the interior of Siberia than they are at present. The request was treated in the most friendly terms. The reason given was the desire to preserve the existing friendly relations with America, which, in view of the American government's undefined attitude on Bolshevism, might otherwise be jeopardized.
