Japanese Do Not Like America

An anti-American campaign of unusual vigor is said to be raging in Japan. Americans may find it hard to understand just why the Japanese should be so angry at us at this time, when we are not conscious of any special offense against them.

The basis for the agitation is said to be "a fear of the growing influence of the United States in international affairs."

There is the old grievance of discrimination against the Japanese in our Pacific coast states, and the fear of more drastic anti-Japanese legislation here.

Resentment has been aggravated by the feeling that the United States is largely to blame for the failure of the Peace Conference to adopt the "racial equality" principle advocated by Japan.

There is a belief, too, that Americans incited the Chinese to make public the secret Sino-Japanese treaties which put Japan in the light of aggressor and persecutor, and that Americans are primarily responsible for the anti-Japanese outbreaks in Korea.
