### YOUNGSTER IN ARMY

Lad of 15 Dies of Pneumonia Contracted in Trenches.

Salman Lerma, 15 years old, the "Little Soldier Man" of the 26th infantry, is dead, says a report from Brownsville, Tex. After three years' service he died of pneumonia in the trenches of France and was buried with military honors. His home town, San Benito, has been asked to place a gold star in its service flag.

He was not an enlisted man, for one can't enlist at 15, wrote Sammie Robertson, lieutenant-colonel of engineers in France, in telling of his death. "But he had been mascot of Company E, 26th infantry, from September, 1915, until death.

"No braver spirit ever served in the United States army. He has no relatives and most of his old company have been killed or wounded. In late November when I saw them there were only three men left who were in the company at San Benito."

Salman, a homeless lad of 12 years, was adopted at San Benito by the 26th, then patrolling the Mexican border. Adventure awaited just over the threshold, and he met the test with a courage that brought instant distinction.

With Robertson, then a civilian, he was driving through a lonely stretch of country 12 miles from San Benito. A band of Mexicans suddenly appeared from a patch of brush and surrounded the automobile. In an instant fighting became general and a rain of bullet-charged against the car, which continued plunging forward, with Robertson and the lad returning the fire. Robertson's hat was shot from his head. The boy escaped unhurt.

When the regiment proceeded to France, Salman went along as mascot and was in the trenches for several months.

### ALASKA MAY BECOME A COW COUNTRY

Canadian Explorers Advancing Developing Musk Oxen in North.

SEATTLE, Wash., May 23—Great plains lying along the Arctic coast to northern Alaska and Canada soon may become America's latest "cow country," said Governor Riggs, of Alaska, and Viljalmar Stefansson, Canadian explorer, are advocating the transplanting and developing of herds of musk oxen into the new barren lands of the far north.

A dispatch received here from Ottawa said the Canadian government may accept Stefansson's proposal that an experimental station be established on Melville Island. Stefansson says there are about 4000 oxen on Melville Island.

Herds later would be moved from Melville Island to the Canadian mainland for breeding and slaughtering, according to Stefansson. Laplanders probably would be secured as "cowboys" to handle the herds.

Arthur Meighen, Canadian minister of the interior, is favorably impressed with the scheme, it is reported. Stefansson recently went before the Canadian parliament and told of his plan for domesticating the oxen. He suggests that reindeer also be imported.

Alaskans interested in the musk oxen project have circulated a petition in the north addressed to congress asking that the animals be obtained from the Canadian Arctic islands and transplanted in northern Alaska. The Alaskans point to the fact that the government about 20 years ago introduced 1200 domestic reindeer into northeastern Alaska.

### CALIFORNIA TO HAVE AN INFLUX

Revival of Pre-War Plans by Resident of the Southern Portions of Europe.

LOS ANGELES, May 23—Six hundred families will leave Southern Europe to make their homes in Southern California within the next six months according to announcement made here by steamship agents.

The arrival of these families will mark the beginning, it is said, of immigration to California of many large groups of Southern Europeans for whose coming here great preparation was made by federal and state officials just before the beginning of the world war, which stopped all plans along that line.

Among the first six hundred families to come to this section where they will take up land-homesteading in some cases, as declaration to become citizens is all that is necessary for the preliminary filing will be French, Belgians and even Swiss. The majority will be agriculturists.

There will be no effort to subsidize the newcomers, who will make their homes in those sections of Southern California where they find land to their liking.

Many persons in the French colony of Los Angeles are interested in the movement to bring the Southern Europeans here.

FISHERMEN CO-OPERATE

SEATTLE, May 23.—Canners, dealers and purse owners of Puget Sound are arranging a meeting, according to Fish Commissioner L. H. Darwin, for the purpose of reaching an agreement to discontinue the catching and packing of immature salmon. This was one of the points which Darwin sought to have incorporated in law at the last state legislative session. However, he said, the fishermen are supporting him because it has been found that the immature salmon have proved a drug on the market.

MUNARY FAVORS AIRPLANE PATROL FOR F. S. FORESTERS

PORTLAND, Ore., May 23—Senator McNary would install an airplane forest fire protection system at Portland, according to a letter received from him by Milton R. Klepper, president of the Aero Club of Oregon, in response to the club's request for the establishment of the airplane fire patrol through co-operation with the forest service.

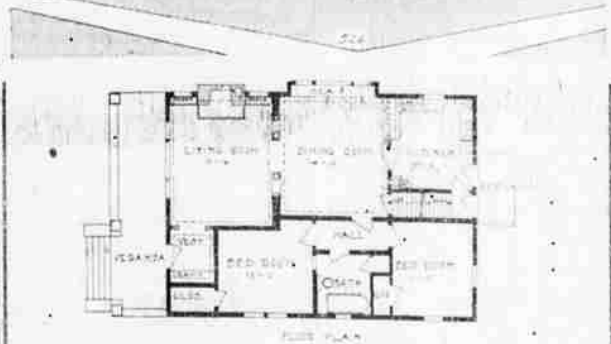
