STATE DIRECTOR ARMENIAN RELIEF COMING SUNDAY

Mr. J. J. Handaker, of Portland, state director of Armenian Relief, was a La Grande visitor Saturday. He came to consult the Sunday School officers of Union county concerning the national Sunday School offering at Christmas. On the invitation of the local ministers, Mr. Handaker will return to Union county for Sunday, June 1, and address a mass meeting in La Grande at night and speak at some other point in the county in the morning. Local arrangements are in charge of E. W. Eastman, Secretary Union County S. S. Association.

Mr. Handaker met with local workers last night and preliminary arrangements were made for a visit to every school in the county. The National Sunday School Secretaries of ten-year demonstrations are now in Armenia inspecting the field and the effectiveness of our effort. Immediately on their return they will issue appeals to all schools from prompt action and Oregon expect to see in line by the time the appeals come.

The Associated Press dispatches this week tell of 500,000 Armenian refugees in the Caucasus alone while the whole near east is suffering such horrors that typhoid, typhus, small pox and cholera added to sheer starvation are taking a daily death toll of 2,000. Thousands of children are being today as a result of Christmas of

festivals of 1917 and 1918 and it is expected that Christmas 1919 will largely exceed the combined offerings of the various years.

Mr. Handaker left yesterday for Pendleton, where he addressed a meeting Sunday night.

NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT

Notice is hereby given to all owners of property in the City of La Grande, Oregon, and to all persons interested in said property, that the City of La Grande, Oregon, has adopted a plan for the improvement of the street known as Adams Avenue, from the east curb line of Spruce Street to the west curb line of Balm Street, and in accordance with the plans and specifications hereof adopted on the 7th day of May, 1919, and now on file in the office of the Recorder of said city. That the preliminary assessment for said proposed improvement is now on file in the office of the said Recorder, and that the boundaries of the improvement district to be affected and benefited by said proposed improvement are as follows, to-wit: Commencing at a point on the center-line of Adams Avenue where the center-line of Spruce Street intersects the center-line of Adams Avenue, and running thence southerly along the center-line of Spruce Street to a point thereon opposite the center-line of Block 7 of Coggan's Addition to La Grande, Oregon, thence in a southerly direction along the center-line of Blocks 7 and 8 of Coggan's Addition, and the center-line of Blocks 6, W, V, X, Y and Z, of Coggan's Second Addition to La Grande, Oregon, to the center-line of Balm Street, and thence northerly along the center-line of Balm Street to the center-line of Adams Avenue, and thence northwesterly along the center-line of Adams Avenue to its place of beginning.

That the City Commission will meet on Wednesday, the 11th day of June, 1919, at 8 o'clock, P. M., at the Commission room in the city building in La Grande, Oregon, and hear and determine all objections, remonstrances and claims of grievance of any person interested.
