 BEN WORSLEY ON THE  
 GOOD ROADS MEASURES  
 \*\*\*  
 Benjamin S. Worsley, of Astoria,  
 visited several points in this  
 part of the state last week in the  
 interests of the state-wide good  
 roads movement. Mr. Worsley is an  
 ardent worker for the cause and  
 he left yesterday for Baker, to car-  
 ry to the voters there the gospel he  
 is preaching regarding the Roose-  
 velt Highway. Mr. Worsley's views  
 on good roads matters, as set forth  
 to the Observer, were expressed as  
 follows:

"If Oregon stands for progress  
 and development, then let the voter  
 speak on the 3d day of June. It is  
 a gratification to me in my cam-  
 paign of the state for the Roose-  
 velt Highway to find that most peo-  
 ple now look at the road question  
 from a broader standpoint than  
 formerly. The day is past when  
 one neighborhood or one section  
 can expect to obtain good roads, yet  
 oppose road building for others.  
 The big factors these days are fed-  
 eral and state aid. In this connec-  
 tion, let me say, that some counties  
 must go beyond the present two  
 per cent. road bonding system in or-  
 der to get a highway system put in  
 to shape where the county will be  
 benefited. That is why it is pro-  
 posed to raise the constitutional

limit to six per cent of the assessed  
 valuation, as one of the measures to  
 be voted on by the people June 3rd.  
 Compliments Union County.

Union county is to be com-  
 mended on its complete and com-  
 prehensive road building program,  
 and every county had such men  
 as Chairman Larsson of the Good  
 Roads committee and backed by  
 such boosters as the Union County  
 Ad Club, before they would soon have  
 the best roads of any state in the  
 Union, and of all parts of it.

"Every county in our state is la-  
 boring under the disadvantage of  
 the two per cent. limitation. The  
 voters should give due weight to  
 this fact and support the six per  
 cent measure on June 3. And it  
 is to be remembered that voting to  
 increase the bonding limit does not  
 mean that any county will issue  
 bonds up to six per cent, or will  
 issue bonds at all. The local bond  
 issue will come before the voters of  
 every county as a separate proposi-  
 tion, and in voting the increase the  
 voter should consider the develop-  
 ment of our whole state and assist  
 the counties that it is necessary for  
 them to avail themselves of its pro-  
 visions so as to get the benefit of  
 money they have already expended

under the existing two per cent.  
 limitation.

The Roosevelt Highway  
 The Roosevelt Military High-  
 way bill on which the people vote  
 at the special election on June 3d  
 provides an appropriation of \$2-  
 500,000 by Oregon on condition  
 that an equal sum be provided by  
 the federal government. If con-  
 gress does not meet its part of the  
 bargain our appropriation cannot  
 be used.

The Roosevelt Highway will be  
 of as much benefit to all other parts  
 of Oregon as it is to the coast  
 counties and it will help to develop  
 Oregon. I hope the voters of Ore-  
 gon will take a broad-minded view  
 of the Roosevelt Highway measure.  
 So far as the people of the state,  
 or Oregon are concerned the Roose-  
 velt Military project will be paid for  
 out of the automobile fund of the state  
 and will be no burden as a direct  
 tax, either in principal or interest.  
 It simply means that the automob-  
 ile owners and the United States  
 government will build the road;  
 open up the great undeveloped  
 coast counties of the state; com-  
 plete a military highway along the  
 400 miles of unprotected coast of  
 Oregon; add \$100,000,000 in val-

uation to the tax roll of the state  
 open up a water level scenic high-  
 way or Oregon's Wonderland—an  
 all-year road that will bring in  
 tourist travel and enrich our state  
 in millions.  
 Oregon needs more men and  
 more money to develop her natural  
 resources. And a large percentage  
 of the travelers are horse seekers  
 as many of them have wealth.  
 Piece's Bill (Good One)  
 "Yes, Senator Pierce's bill, of  
 Union county, the one mill Market  
 Road bill is just as important as  
 all the roads measures are, at the  
 Market Road bill should be the  
 support of every vote on June  
 3d, as it is one of the complete  
 whole which goes to make up a  
 good road program of Oregon.

Every measure that is submitted  
 to the people by the 1919 legisla-  
 ture had careful consideration by  
 the House and Senate; and if the  
 people of Oregon had that confi-  
 dence which they manifested in the  
 election of the voters and repre-  
 sentatives, then they should go  
 down to the polls for every amendment  
 for the development of our great  
 state of Oregon.

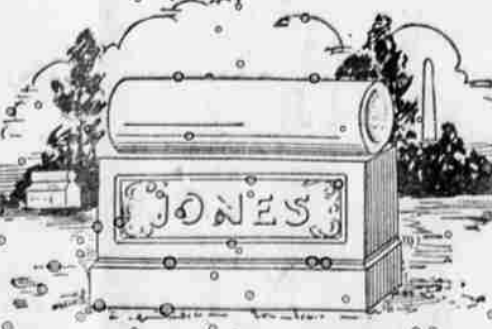

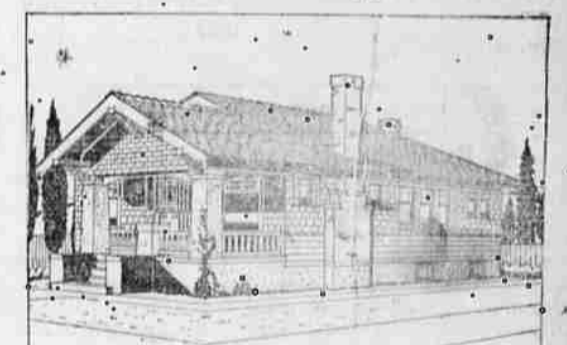
