### YOUTHFUL WONDERS

At 10, Goethe Wrote Story in Seven Different Languages

One character common to genius and to insanity, especially moral insanity, is precocity. Cesare Lombroso, professor of legal medicine, University of Turin, relates that Dante, when 9 years of age, wrote a sonnet to Beatrice; Tasso wrote verses at 10, Pascal and Corne were great thinkers at the ages of 12. Former at 15, Niebuhr at 7, Jonathan Edwards at 12, Michelangelo at 19, Gassendi, the Little Doctor, at 4, Bossuet at 12, and Voltaire at 13. Pico de la Mirandola knew Latin, Greek, Hebrew, Chaldean and Arabic in his childhood. Goethe wrote a story in seven languages when he was scarcely 10; Wieland knew Latin at 7, meditated an epic poem at 13, and at 16 published his poem, "Die Volkommene Welt." Schiller was only 19 when he wrote "Raghu." Victor Hugo composed "Hernani" at 15. Pope wrote his ode to solitude at 12, and Byron published verses at 16. Moore translated "Anacreon" at 13. Meyerbeer at 5 played excellently on the piano. Claude Joseph Vernet drew very well at 4 and at 29 was a celebrated painter. At 13 Wren invented an astronomical instrument, and offered it to his father with a Latin dedication.

Raphael was famous at 14. Beethoven composed three sonatas at 12. Elchorn, Mozart and Kytler gave concerts at 6. Weber was only 13 when his first opera, "Das Waldmarchen," was presented. Bacon conceived the "Novum Organum" at 17. Charles XII. manifested his great designs at 19.

### French Port Haggis Trade

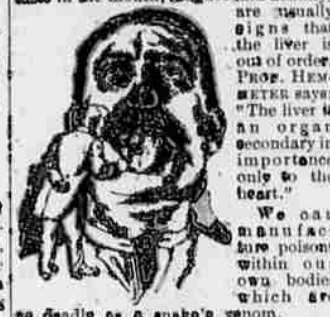

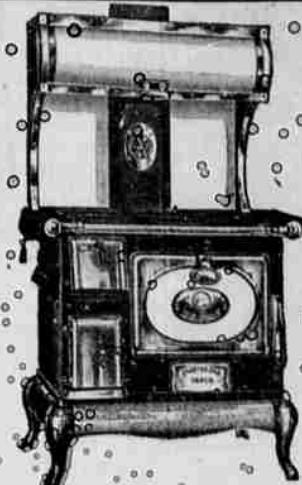

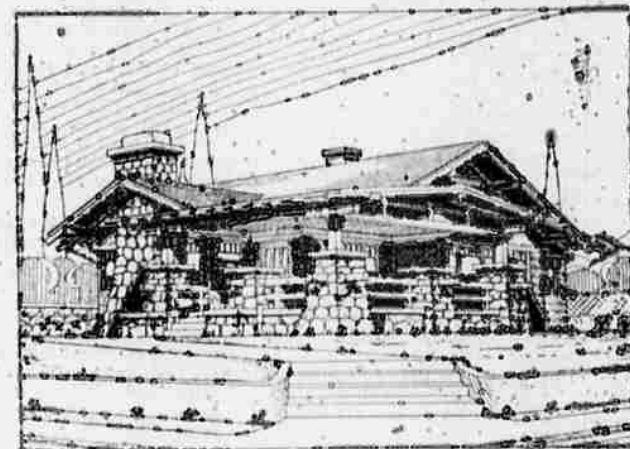
