### WILL INVEST IN PHILIPPINES

HONOLULU, T. H., (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—A group of capitalists of Hawaii are preparing to invest \$5,000,000 in the sugar industry of the Philippines. John A. King and John Hild, representatives of the Hawaiian financiers, will be in connection with the enterprise. It is not planned to engage in actual planting of sugar, but to erect large sugar mills at central points and to otherwise encourage development of the industry. Late Manila papers report that the Hawaiian men are making good progress.

### ANTIFLU SERUM RECEIVED

PAGOAGO, American Samoa, (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—A large supply of anti-influenza serum has been received in American Samoa from the U. S. Navy Department. Dr. Dillard, U. S. N., chief surgeon, in Tafutu, with a large staff, is travelling through the islands, and treating all the inhabitants to an injection of the serum. A boat conveying some of the serum to an outlying station, was swamped during some rough seas, and to save the load and crew all medicines and supplies had to be thrown overboard.

### TO DOMESTICATE CARIBOU

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, (Correspondence of The Associated Press)—Fairbanks residents now living on north fork of the Big Chena river

### next fall plan to experiment in domesticating the wild Alaska caribou.

The north fork of this river has been a natural feeding ground for the caribou for the year round, and if the government permit has been given for the men to take into captivity 25 young caribou for their experiment. High corrals will be built this summer and supplies shipped in. Should the experiment prove successful, Alaskans see the possibilities of a great industry which will provide an abundance of fine fresh meat for the interior, as well as choice morsels for export.

### MUSEUM AT HAWAII

HONOLULU, T. H., (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—Professor Herbert Ernest Gregory, zoologist and until recently a member of the faculty of Yale University, has arrived here to become director of the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum, said to have the finest collection of Polynesian antiquities in the world. Professor Gregory succeeds Dr. William T. Brigham who now becomes director emeritus.

The museum was founded as a memorial to Princess Pauahi, an Hawaiian princess, who married one of Honolulu's first and wealthiest businessmen and who bequeathed her estate to the University of Hawaii. A large part of her private fortune, many millions, has been devoted to the "endowment" of science and for other works deemed to improve the condition of the native population by giving it necessary tools in development.

One of the objects of the museum is to mark the feast of Cook the property of the Hawaiian people. The Great Captain, which a Squadron of one million dollars has been spent, is now in a special vault and is only exhibited at rare intervals.
