BREST, France. (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—The United States warship Pinta, one of the largest converted yachts sent to France in June, 1917, for convoy duty is expected to return to her

The Pinta was formerly the Kanawha II owned by the late H. H. Rogers. She was purchased from Mr. Rogers by Lieutenant Commander John Borden and presented by him to the government. Lieutenant Commander Borden served aboard in foreign waters for over eighteen months.

The Pinta was one of the fastest yachts in the famous "Britannia Patrol" and conveyed many thousands of troops safely to France during the early days of 1917 before the destroyers had arrived for duty on the coast of France. She is credited with one of the fastest crossings of the Atlantic. She is in command of Lieutenant Grant T. Stephenson.
