On June 7th the Fire Department was called to 2106 Maple street for caused by burning lamp. The house a three room cottage, was practically destroyed, and most of the furniture, on which there was some insurance, was also destroyed. Six hundred feet of hose was laid. The run to the fire was made in about the usual time but the fire had gained such headway by the time the department arrived that it was impossible to save much.

The new arrangement of fire boxes has been completed and the boxes tested out. This arrangement will make the system more efficient as one run of numbers is used for each section of the city and there is less cause for confusion in getting and locating a call.

There were nine arrests by the police department for the week, 2 for officers outside city; 3 for traffic violations; one for cigarette smoking and two sleepers. Fines for the week \$35.00. A number of leaks in the pipe lines were repaired, the hydrants flushed and three new traps made. The penstock or well at the Beaver creek dam has been repaired and the Beaver creek pipe line inspected and repaired where necessary. The joint of pipe at the intake was removed to ascertain if any rock or other obstruction had gotten into the main. A small quantity of gravel was found but not enough to make any material difference in the flow of water. We have been unable as yet to increase the supply of water to any appreciable extent although the entire Beaver creek line is being made to ascertain what quantity of water the pipe line is capable of delivering. At the same time what additional supply may be obtained from other streams in the vicinity of the intake. The overflow at Beaver creek is filling rapidly and will probably be full within the next week or ten days. Respectfully submitted, JOHN COLLIER

### LIKE THE SERVICE ON MEXICAN BORDER

Very Large Percentage of Men in Service There Have Re-enlisted in Cavalry Service

MARFA, Tex., June 12.—Mexican border service is attractive to young Americans who like to ride, shoot and live in the open. To prove that the lure of being "riders of the purple sage" is strong for his men, Colonel George T. Langhorne, commanding the Big Bend district of Texas quotes figures to show that 467 of his men had re-enlisted since the recruiting order was issued in an effort to retain border veterans in the cavalry service. During the first month the recruiting order was in effect 350 men re-enlisted and the total enlistments for a second or third tour of duty in the Big Bend are more than 15 per cent of the total strength of the border troops in this district.

On the outpost at Ruidosa, miles from the nearest habitation, 90 per cent of troop M. Eighth Cavalry, re-enlisted. The machine-gun troop showed the highest percentage with 29 re-enlistments. Troop I was a close second with 28 re-enlistments. Colonel Langhorne considers the showing of his recruiting campaign all the more remarkable because the fact that the district command has been stationed in the Big Bend district, away from a large city, almost two years. This, he says, explains the eagerness for re-enlistment on the part of the men. The moral is higher and the spirit of

regimental loyalty more intense because the men are thrown more together in the wild, are not distracted from their military duties by the attractions of a large city nearby and come in closer and more personal contact with the officers commanding them. This explains why the men voted almost as a unit to remain in the Big Bend rather than transfer to Fort Bliss, Colonel Langhorne added.
