**DEAL AT ENTERPRISE**  
Hess R. Falconer Buys a Large Sheep Ranch From His Brother, Fred W. Falconer.

The Enterprise Record-Chief says that Hess R. Falconer has bought one of the Innaha sheep ranches of his brother, Fred W. Falconer, and has gone into the business. He takes the Harry N. Vaughn place on the river, below the bridge, and other land adjoining it, amounting to a total of 1250 acres. He also has bought Albert Morgan's band of sheep, which he received the first of the week, and has taken over Mr. Morgan's stamper and fall range.  
To conduct his new business, Mr. Falconer will have to spend much of his time on the Innaha. He will keep his home in town, however, and his family will remain here much of the time, particularly in the winter and during the school months.  
In the sale of the Innaha land, F. W. Falconer took his brother's brick building on Greenwood and West First streets, where R. R. Falconer has had a grain and feed store. This business will be closed out and the building disposed of, as the new purchaser has no use for it. ### RESIGNS AS COUNTY CLERK

L. E. Jordan has resigned as county clerk and W. J. Ortman has been named in his place, says the Record-Chief. The change will take effect the first of July. Mr. Jordan has accepted a position as auditor for the Wallowa Milling & Grain company, which will give him general supervision of the concern's books and accounts. He will spend most of his time at the Enterprise office, but will visit the branches occasionally at Joseph, Logtown, Wallowa and La Grande to assist in keeping the accounting system running in smooth order.  
Mr. Ortman is now deputy sheriff and so is familiar with county business and court house details. It is

expected that the present deputies in the clerk's office will remain. A successor to Mr. Ortman as deputy sheriff has not been named.

Mr. Jordan is an expert accountant and office manager and so possesses the necessary qualifications for his new position. The company which started its business only a year ago has expanded rapidly under the management of Wade Siler until it now operates on a large scale. It is the local branch of the Pacific Grain company, which means the Houser grain interests, and also does a large automobile business.
