was one of leaving the place for the automobile race. It had been first proposed to hold them at the Speed 'Em Up track, four miles from the city. Opinions were expressed at the meeting, however, that only a very small portion of the crowd here on the Fourth would travel to the Speed 'Em Up track to see the race and the afternoon for that would therefore be barren of entertainment. The dust which is an ever-present and disagreeable factor in events at the track helped a good deal in reaching the decision to hold the races at the fair grounds. Though the "milk" track, it was admitted, would give the racers a better chance to open their machines up, it was pointed out that the track is not in good condition and that a large sum of money would be required to put it in such shape that decent times could be made. It was the general opinion that the people would better enjoy remaining in their seats at the fair grounds and watching smaller cars make somewhat slower time than to travel the distance to the other track. The meeting decided that the prizes for the races would be put up by the Ad club and the club should therefore have the privilege of stating where the races should be held. The other plan was to charge an admission fee and divide the receipts among the winners of the races.

Minor Matters Discussed
Suggestion that a barbecue be arranged as a part of the day's entertainment was made by J. D. McKennon, and was favored by many before the holding of the parade was decided upon. When this was done, however, Mr. McKennon with drew his suggestion, stating that he thought the day would be sufficiently full without his idea being carried out.

The matter of having the grandstand at the fair grounds inspected was mentioned and assurance was given by the chairman and by the city manager that plans had already been made to have the stand strengthened and repaired so as to be entirely safe for the large crowd that will certainly make use of it.

The Program Outlined
The program, as it has been outlined, will be officially opened at 9 o'clock Friday morning. The unofficial celebration will likely be opened about 5 a. m. when the kids start their fireworks going, but the parade at 9 will open the Ad Club's program. The route for the parade has not been determined yet, nor the size of it, but it will likely take up an hour and a half of the morning. The crowd will go to the fair grounds after the parade and will have the pleasure then of hearing

Rev. Bill Sunday speak. He will talk until lunch time—nothing more definite is said, as it is not known at what hour Mr. Sunday is in the habit of lunching—but after the address the crowd will be at liberty to go where they wish for their lunch. Most of them, it is expected, will go to the park. Hot coffee will be provided there for those who have their lunch with them. In the afternoon, then, at 2:30 or 3 o'clock, the automobile race will commence, and this will, as far as is known now, comprise the balance of the day's entertainment.
