You will enjoy every minute you spend with these talented people. They bring to you the greatest of all health tonics—a host of hearty laughs.

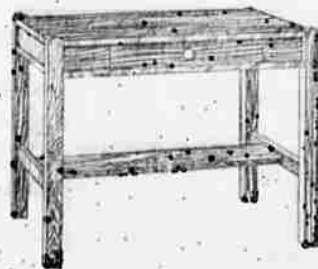
Prominent Men and Women Affiliated With Board of Directors

Mobile and motorcycle traffic in the park during the chautauqua are simple. Machines entering the park must keep to the right if they drive through the park, if they are more going to the pavilion they enter the usual way at the west gate and park their cars in the usual way and take exit to the north gate.
