## "No Accident Week" On Western Roads This Week

All the allroads comprising the no-accident central section, consisting of 115 railroads, with nearly 150,000 miles of track, are staging what is known as a "No Accident Week" from June 22 to 28th inclusive.

The United States railroad administration will endeavor to make these railroad systems during that week without an accident of any kind.

On the railroad properties under federal management, J. P. O'Brien, which includes the Oregon-Washington railroad and navigation line, the Southern Pacific lines north of Ashland, the Northern Pacific Terminal of Oregon, the San Francisco & Portland Steamship lines and the Pacific coast railroad, an intensified campaign for safety is being conducted by the employees among themselves and the public. So-called safety meetings are being held, large numbers of circulars and posters are being distributed, and talks on safety are being given to the employees in groups on the entire properties. The employees are urged to use caution and avoid negligent or careless acts, as statistics prove that 95 per cent of deaths and injuries are the result of carelessness or kindred faults.

### Public Must Co-operate

While the employees are doing all possible to keep from injuring the automobilist or any vehicle driver at the railroad crossing, as well as the person who walks along the track or tries to steal a life they are nearly helpless in doing so unless the public likewise is cognizant of the danger lurking at the crossing on the train and on the track. The entire 100 per cent of deaths and injuries to non-employees on railroads would be avoided if the public would heed the various warning signs at crossings and stations and use reasonable care while on trains.

The railroad employees therefore appeal to the public to help make this "No Accident Week" a success and show the entire United States that here but west we care.

Don't try to steal a ride on a train or any fall under or between cars and be ground to death.

If you are a passenger in a train, don't put heavy articles overhead may cause it to fall and injure you underneath. Avoid putting things in the aisles. When you walk through the aisle don't stumble on a suitcase or ladder which may be in the aisle.

Be careful in closing doors so they won't crush your hand or finger.
