According to information submitted to the convention the plan would "bring together industrial heads and labor leaders to study problems affecting capital and labor and suggest remedial legislation."

A list of those suggested to represent labor is headed by Frank P. Walsh, former joint chairman of the board. Mr. Comper's name was second. Mention of the proposed plan brought a storm of denunciation from the delegates.
