"THE UNWRITTEN LAW" AS A MOTION-PICTURE DRAMA

Edwin Milton Royle's "The Unwritten Law" has been developed in all its episodes and made into a motion picture drama, in which the "problem" is rendered of secondary interest to the plot, and in which the three principals are not so much types for play manipulation as they are flesh-and-blood human beings who live, rejoice, suffer and experience the mutations to which all flesh is heir. I mean that "The Unwritten Law" is a complex drama and humanistic life.

By all odds it is the most important of the productions of the California Motion Picture Corporation and the finest which yet employed to exploit the grace and beauty of its star, Beatrice Michelena.

While comparisons are usually odious, they may sometimes be indulged, and it is safe to contrast this latest achievement of the California Corporation with any or all of its prior contributions to the "literature of the screen."

In plot it makes an appeal not found in "Salome Jane," with all of the latter's picturesque beauty. "The Unwritten Law" takes hold of fundamental truths and reveals them in their logical relations, each episode linking itself with the preceding and succeeding scenes as matched pearls are strung on a string. The purely romantic chain and the scenic revelations of "Mignon" give place in this later exploit to the narration of a story of the present, with a significance as timely as a news item. While "The Unwritten Law" is adapted to the times through the medium of a powerfully moral lesson, it never preaches, as "Salvation Nell" is sometimes inclined to do. Whatever of precept there is contained in "The Unwritten Law" is in nerve, vigorous and intensive, but it becomes an integral part of the story. But what will make a more notable appeal to the picture-loving world than any of these attributes just named, is the terrific speed of this story, its multitude of exciting scenes, and the diversity of the adventures which befall its principal characters. It would also seem as though its author and its producer had given themselves the task of exhibiting in "The Unwritten Law" every kind of thrilling episode which has been found most compelling on the screen to bring the sleep of suspense, the heat of excitement, the tear of sympathy or the cry of alarm.

Redemption of Stamped Paper from the Public

REDEMPTION OF STAMPED PAPER FROM THE PUBLIC

In connection with the reduction of postage rates on letters, which takes effect Tuesday, July 1, the local post-office has been instructed to the following effect:

Postmasters shall redeem from the public all unused and undamaged No. 9 and No. 10 two-cent cards and three-cent envelopes, printed or unprinted, at full value, provided they are cancelled such cards and envelopes are presented by the rightful owners. Postmasters shall furnish in exchange for such cards and envelopes, postage stamps, postal cards, or stamped envelopes of other denominations or varieties to be selected by the owner, or may apply them in payment or part payment for 2-cent special request envelopes. No postal cards nor stamped envelopes shall be redeemed from the public in cash. The public will be allowed one month from July 1 in which to present their cards and envelopes for exchanges at full value. After the expiration of that time, postage value for the envelopes and three-fourth of postage value for the cards only shall be allowed.

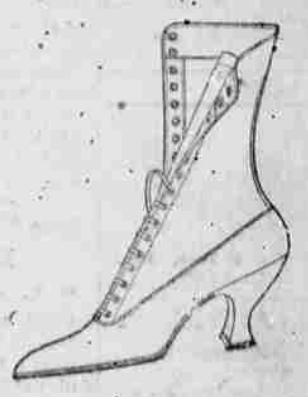
