MORE PEOPLE NEEDED IN WORK

GOVERNMENT AFTER MEN AND WOMEN TO FILL POSITIONS

Salaries Considered Only Fair as Compared to Wages Paid in Private Life

Postmaster Myers of Portland has sent out notices of a civil service examination to fill many vacancies needed by the government. When the salary list is scrutinized many consider the wages too low in comparison with trades and workers in private life. The notice sent out is as follows:

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced a civil service examination for postoffice clerks and carriers, to be held in the new Portland postoffice building July 12th.

The examination is comparatively simple, and those who successfully pass will stand a good chance to receive appointment as substitutes. The pay of substitute clerks and carriers, as fixed by act of congress, is 40 cents an hour until they receive their regular appointment.

Regular clerks and carriers receive \$1,000 per annum the first year, and if their efficiency records are satisfactory, they will receive an annual promotion of \$100 until they receive \$1,500 per annum.

Clerks and carriers work eight hours per day, and are paid for overtime in proportion to their salaries, in addition to their annual leave

No Relief From High Prices Yet

RECORDS SHOW COST OF LIVING STILL RISING.
 Department of Labor Statement Says Retail Price of 22 Articles Advance Two Per Cent in Month.

Ham and Round Steak each increased 3 per cent in last April and May; Sirloin Steak increased 3 per cent in April and 2 per cent in May; Rib Roast increased 4 per cent in April, and 7 per cent in May.

The above report of the Department of Labor does not apply to our market. There is no reduction in the price of Ham, but we have reduced the price of Round Steak 8 1/2 per cent, Sirloin Steak 14 per cent, and Rib Roast 9 per cent; the cost of Veal Mutton and Lamb have been reduced from 10 to 30 per cent.
