Quiet In Siberia Will See Rush of Prospectors Across Behring Sea

(By Associated Press to The Observer)

CORDOVA, Alaska, June 10.—(By Mail.)—Alaskan "sourdoughs" looking across the Behring Sea to Siberia with a view of going into that country in numbers and washing Siberian sands for gold and platinum. "Siberia is a second Alaska, rich in minerals, timber and fur," J. L. M. Pherson, manager of the Alaska Bureau of the Seattle Chamber of Commerce, has been quoted as saying. "There is a big country lying across the Behring Sea awaiting American men and money."

Reports from Nome say a number of old-timers of the Seward Peninsula are thinking of crossing to Siberia. "If the allies restored order and government to Vladivostok, however, the unsettled state of affairs in Siberia kept the Americans out."

Twelve pioneer Alaskans are numbered among the stockholders of the recently organized Siberian Commercial Company which last month bought the steamship Gadeny and started for St. Lawrence Bay, Siberia to establish a trading post.

Aboard the Gadeny when it left Seattle

attled for Siberia, were twenty-five stockholders who intended trying their luck washing the sands of St. Lawrence for gold. Next fall the new company plans to send a representative to Vladivostok as the first step in enlarging its sphere of operations.
