The cynic is one who never sees a good quality in a man and never fails to see a bad one. He is the human owl, vigilant in darkness and blind to light, mousing for vermin, and never seeing noble mice.

The cynic puts all human actions into only two classes—openly bad and secretly bad. All virtue, and generosity, and disinterestedness are merely the appearance of good, but selfish at the bottom. He holds that no man does a good thing except for profit. The effect of his conversations upon your feelings is to chill and sour them, to send you away sour and morose.

His criticizing and innuendos fall indiscriminately upon every lovely thing like frost upon the flowers. If Mr. A. is pronounced a religious man, he will reply: "Yes, on Sundays." Mr. B. has just joined the church; certainly, the elections are coming on. The minister of the gospel is called an example of diligence; it is his trade. Such a man is generous of other people's money. This man is obliging; to tell and cheat you. That man is upright because he is green.

Thus his eye strains out every good quality, and takes in only the bad. To him religion is hypocrisy, honesty a preparation for fraud, virtue only a want of opportunity, and undeniable purity, asceticism. The living day he will coldly sit with a sneering lip, transfixing every character that is presented.

It is impossible to indulge in such habitual severity of opinion of our fellow men, without injuring the tenderness and delicacy of our own feelings. A man will be what his inmost cherished feelings are. If he grows angry a noble generosity; every feeling will be enriched by it; if he grows bitter and venomous thoughts, his own spirit will absorb the poison, and he will crawl among men as a burrhead, whose life is mischief, and whose errand is death.

He who hunts for flowers will find flowers, and he who loves weeds will find weeds. Let it be remembered that no man who is himself not morally diseased, will have a relish for the morbid ambition of the cynic or cease to call himself a man.

Vigorous Campaign Against Grasshoppers Gets Good Results

ENTERPRISE, Ore., July 7.—Farmers on Merr Flat and the Di have been conducting a winning fight on grasshoppers which appeared in great numbers in the district a few weeks ago. Four tons of poison prepared under the direction of Miss Holte, county agent, have been put, and the pests are rapidly disappearing. The fight was taken up before the hoppers had become numerous to any extent. Last year two crops were destroyed before a start was made.

Grass hoppers are not reported from any other part of the county except Elk Mountain, where a few have appeared. Many fields have proved they can be exterminated by poison if the whole community joins in the campaign.

Nicaraguan Burial Custom

Among the Indians of eastern Nicaragua when a person dies the body is buried at once and a little house is built over the grave in which the soul is believed to live for the time being. A field of sweet manioc is planted. In about eight months time the roots are ready for use, so a general invitation to a great San or Sivero dance is sent out. A cotton string is stretched over the grave to the dancing place, where the end of it hangs down into a great bowl of manioc.

RECORDS SHOW COST OF LIVING STILL RISING.

Department of Labor Statement Says Retail Price of 22 Articles Advance Two Per Cent in Month.

Ham and Round Steak each increased 1 per cent in both April and May; Sirloin Steak increased 5 per cent in April and 2 per cent in May; Rib Roast increased 4 per cent in April, and 4 per cent in May.

The above report of the Department of Labor does not apply to our market. There is no reduction in the price of ham, but we have reduced the price of Round Steak 5 per cent, Sirloin Steak 14 per cent, and Rib Roast 5 per cent; the rate of Veal, Mutton and Lamb have been reduced from 3 to 25 per cent.
