ANCIENT PLATE IS UNCOVERED

Excavation for the Queen Street museum struck a small pit which was filled to the brim with battered silver vessels and a few coins of the Emperor Valens and Gratian. The vessels were crushed and disfigured, indicating that they were regarded as booty and intended for the melting pot. They include flagons, chalices, platters, bowls and spoons. On them can be deciphered Christian symbols, such as Chi-Rho, Alpha, Omega and Iota Christos. Scenes portrayed in relief are mainly from Bible history.

The gem of the collection is a richly decorated flask, beautifully embossed and bearing the inscription, "Prymaceosiahi," which has not yet been translated. Archeologists have not been able to say whether the vessels were spoils taken from one single church or from a number of different places. Some of the silver is gilded, some enameled, and some inlaid with gold.

FINDS CLUE TO BURIED GOLD

Custodian of Ruins of Jesuit Mission in Arizona on Track of Ancient Treasure.

Tucson, Ariz.—What is believed to be the first clue to the reputed buried treasures of the padres of the Tumacacori mission, built by Spanish Jesuits high up in the Tumacacori mountains, less than three hours' journey from Tucson, has been discovered by Frank Pinckley, custodian of the ruins. It is the gateway to the mission cemetery. From this gateway, it is said, the plans and maps left by the padres start to outline the way to the buried gold and silver. The Tumacacori mission was built near what are believed to be the ruins of one of the Seven Cities of Cibola. The entire region is said to show evidences of rich mineral deposits, which, declare those who have inspected the mountains, doubtless led the padres to build their mission there.

Thieves Return Loot.
Cleveland, Ohio.—Friday thieves took \$955 in cash from a trunk in Edward Fuczek's home here.

Full Glory of Cherry Blossoms.
Blooming of the cherry trees in Japan occurred earlier this year than usual, owing to the exceptionally warm weather of the early months. The blossoms were out in great profusion on Sunday, March 30. The high sakura trees in Ueno park were in full bloom; the yoshino sakura, or common variety, came out in full blossom on April 3, the anniversary of the first emperor of Japan. Everybody in Japan is enjoying the arborecence of springtime.

JENNY LIND'S PIANO IS SOLD

White and Gold Instrument That Cost P. T. Barnum \$5,000 Is Treated as Junk.

Middletown, Conn.—On a big platform truck, with its legs in the air, the white and gold Crystal Palace piano specially built by P. T. Barnum for the concert of Jenny Lind in 1859 was carted off a few days ago by a New Haven collector who had purchased it from Thomas E. Smith, a local dealer in antiques.

When Barnum contracted with the Swedish Nightingale for a concert tour of the United States, for which he paid her the then magnificent sum of \$303,000, he had Fox & Co. of New York construct a mammoth square piano for the concert, the price of which was over \$5,000. While this piano was used no duplicate was to be made. Its case and legs were of San Domingo mahogany, enameled in ivory and embellished in gold.

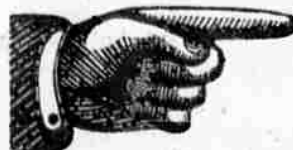
