### "TEDDY" COMING OUT TO OREGON

Roosevelt has been indefatigably his efforts to make Legion a great success. There have been rumors of personal ambition connected with his work but he downed them by his steadfast refusal to accept the chairmanship, or any other office in the organization, at the St. Louis caucus. This, in spite of the fact that for nearly an hour the "root" of the great convention hall trembled to the shouts of "We want Teddy" voiced by delegates from every state.

"Teddy" is now on a speaking tour of the country in the behalf of the Legion. He is due in Oregon in September. Original dates called for his appearance in Portland September 17, but it is very likely that the date will be changed for a week later in order that he may be a speaker at the first state convention of the Legion to be held in Portland, September 24, 25 and 26.

The same week that Oregon is holding its convention the state of Washington plans its state meeting in Seattle, so that Roosevelt will be able to attend both sessions. He will confine his speaking to Portland and Seattle, however, for his tour will include several valley cities and probably at least one city in Eastern Oregon. Pendleton, Salem, Eugene and Medford have been mentioned but no definite dates have been made. Cities desiring him should get their bids in early though it will be impossible for him to speak everywhere he will be wanted. Barge E. Leonard of Portland state treasurer of the American Legion, has been named chief of the speakers' bureau for Oregon by John J. Sullivan of Seattle, first vice-president of the national organization.

responsible to the thousands who had three engines, port, starboard and aft, and a fourth in the bow. With forward, running and two others in reserve the R-34 glided off toward the south and then swung in a westerly course.

The great ship presented a beautiful picture as she drifted up into the sky bathed in the white light of three powerful searchlights.

**Great White Comet**  
At 12:01 lights along the deck of the dirigible were switched on and the great ship herself appeared a long streak of light swinging in the radiance of the searchlight.

Up to 12:01 the R-34 had drifted sideways in the current of a southwest wind. At this hour she nosed into the wind now sailing at about 900 feet and one minute later disappeared from the view of the crowd at Roosevelt Field.

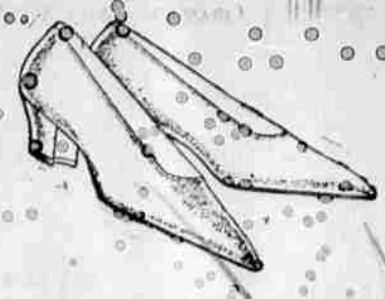

## No Relief From High Prices Yet

RECORDS SHOW COST OF LIVING STILL RISING.  
Department of Labor Statement Says Retail Price of 22 Articles Advance Two Per Cent in Month.  
Ham and Round Steak each increased 5 per cent in both April and May; Sirloin Steak increased 5 per cent in April and 2 per cent in May; Rib Roast increased 4 per cent in April, and 4 per cent in May.  
The above report of the Department of Labor does not apply to our market. There is no reduction in the price of Ham, but we have reduced the price of Round Steak 40 per cent, Sirloin Steak 14 per cent, and Rib Roast 4 per cent; the cuts of Veal, Mutton and Lamb have been reduced from 20 to 25 per cent.
