State News

The Warm Springs irrigation district has asked the state irrigation securities commission to certify \$400,000 worth of bonds which are being advertised for sale August 5. This is a part of the second issue of bonds voted by the district at an election May 7 at which time an issue of \$600,000 was authorized. This is in addition to the original issue of \$750,000.

A report from Hood River on Friday says that fire early this morning destroyed the plant of the Oregon Lumber company on Dead Point creek in the southeastern part of this county and spreading to the surrounding forest, has caused \$20,000 damage. Insurance of \$4000 on the plant is reported.

A heavy rain fell Friday in the John Day region, according to word received by W. W. Cydior, forest supervisor. The rain was badly needed as crops have been suffering from the dry weather.

Pendleton will be headquarters this fall for a United States game warden, according to word received by H. F. Averill, of the U. S. Biological Survey. The federal game warden will have Eastern Oregon as his duties will be the enforcement of the migratory bird law. It is probable that the appointment of the warden will be made soon.

The forest fire near Heppner, in the Ditch Creek region, is now fully under control, according to word received by W. W. Cydior, forest supervisor. Fire fighters have succeeded in subduing the flames.

UNION—The crop here promises to be considerably better than the crop of last year, although there will be but between 75 and 80 per cent. of a normal crop. The spring wheat is too far gone in many places to be revived, even should rain fall copiously during the rest of the season.

NORTH POWDER—There will be no crop to speak of on the dry land this year. The irrigated land will yield about two-thirds of a normal crop. Shortage of water for irrigating purposes has caused it to suffer considerably. The first cutting of the hay crop has given about 75 per cent of a normal yield. The fall wheat is making a fairly good showing.

ELGIN—The fall wheat here will average about twenty bushels to the acre. The spring grain will be good for holding but hay, and all around there will be about fifty per cent. of an average crop.

SANDRIDGE—Fall wheat on the Sandridge is expected to average about thirty bushels to the acre. The spring wheat is very poor, but rains would still prove of some benefit to it. An average crop of hay has been cut.

No Relief From High Prices Yet

RECORDS SHOW COST OF LIVING STILL RISING.
Department of Labor Statement Says Retail Price of 22 Articles Advance Two Per Cent in Month.

Ham and Round Steak each increased 3 per cent in both April and May; Sirloin Steak increased 5 per cent in April and 2 per cent in May; Rib Roast increased 4 per cent in April, and 2 per cent in May.

The above report of the Department of Labor does not apply to our market. There is no reduction in the price of Ham, but we have reduced the price of Round Steak 8 1/2 per cent, Sirloin Steak 14 per cent, and Rib Roast 9 per cent; the cuts of Veal, Mutton and Lamb have been reduced from 9 to 20 per cent.
