**DEER PLENTIFUL IT IS REPORT**  
People Tell of Seeing Many in Granite and Greenhorn Mountains.

It is reported by people who have been in the Granite and Greenhorn mountains and at the head of the Grande Ronde river, as well as in the Cornucopia range, that deer are more plentiful than has been noted for several years, and elk, too, seem to be on the increase.
