## State News

World famous Hood River apples in large quantities will be shipped to the Scandinavian countries as a result of the visit to Hood River of the party of Scandinavian traders who are in Portland placing contracts for ships of all sorts of Northwest products. In addition to the apples the traders will take many carloads of peas, providing the growers are able to furnish them.

Choking on a peanut that had become lodged in windpipe, Clyde L. Lewis, 8-year-old son of Mrs. Guy Redding of Wending, died before a mid could be given him on Sunday night. It was first thought that the child had taken poison.

Efforts to have Lieutenant Colonel Theodore Roosevelt Jr., speak in Eugene while on his tour of the West are to be made by the local post of the American Legion.

Girls from all parts of Oregon, are arriving at Cannon Beach for the Y. W. C. A. girl's camp summer conference. The conference will continue until July 25.

The Vale Milling & Elevator company was organized last week and within the next 60 days will have completed a three story modern flouring mill.

Organization of the Malheur County Great War Veterans' association has been completed and the first meeting will be held at Vale the first Sunday in August.

J. H. Sook, who has been in charge of Columbia river highway work between Hood River and Mosier, has been granted a two-months' leave of absence.

Mrs. Alice Skeen, wanted in Portland on a charge of having married a second husband without having been divorced from the first, is under arrest at Salem.

**FLOODS CAUSE HEAVY LOSSES IN ARGENTINA**  
BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, July 16.—Government reports show that 1,900,000 sheep and 100,000 cattle have been drowned in floods in the southern part of Buenos Aires province. The railways and telegraphic communication have been interrupted and several sections in that region have been completely isolated for more than a week.

The floods were due to a month of the heaviest rainfall ever recorded here.

Over on the Chilean side of Argentina the ice have been further heavy snowfalls along the trans-Andine railway, causing new damage to the line. The snowfall in this region has been nearly continuous for a month and in some places is more than 25 feet deep.

A small party of Americans arrived overland from the Pacific coast of Antofagasta, Chile, last night. They reported almost unendurable hardships during their week's journey.

**HELP NEEDED IN STATE FLAX FIELDS**  
SALEM, July 17.—Because of the necessity of speed in saving the state flax crop the board of control has decided to organize a crew of fifty men to help the convicts, and another crew of twenty boys of the training school. Fifty-four convicts are working in the flax fields but the crop is being sun killed.

**HUGE NAVY GUNS**  
LONDON, (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—The British Admiralty has revealed that one of the developments of the navy in the war was an 18-inch gun which fired a ton and a half shell, seven feet long, twenty miles, with sufficient force to pierce a foot of the hardest steel. It was used in the memorable attack on Zeebrugge with excellent effect.

**WILL PLACE NO QUARANTINE ON MIDDLE WEST WHEAT**  
WASHINGTON, July 17.—No quarantine against wheat shipments from Illinois, Indiana, West Virginia and Georgia, because of ergot disease in those states, will be declared at this time, by the federal horticultural board. This decision was reached by the board Tuesday, after hearings.

**GERMANS BUY FOOD FROM ARMY**  
COBLENZ, (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—Civilians in the American occupied area of Germany have been buying nearly a million marks worth of food daily during the last few weeks from the United States army supplies. The amount sold thus far totals 40,000,000 marks. Germans in Treves and Coblenz have organized a non-profit association which deals with the Inter Allied Military Commission on Food, the supplies being distributed to the consumer through the retailers who are allowed a limited profit on all sales.

Such staples as bacon, rice and canned milk were at first sold to the Germans by the commission of experts' reports that the poorer classes, especially the women and children, were in need of certain foods. Later, when thousands of American soldiers were homeward bound the commission decided to open certain stores of the army to the Germans, owing to the fact that there was more food on hand than the army had use for.

Much of the food is brought to the occupied area from the army depots in France, the Germans buying at a small profit to the American army, plus the transportation charges from the United States.

To date food valued at more than forty million marks has been sold to the civilians of the American occupied zone, all from army stores.
