La Grande, July 16, 1919. To the Honorable Commission, City of La Grande, Oregon. Gentlemen: I have to report for week ending July 12, as follows:

From the Police Department—Arrests for the week, 3; one for state, and two for traffic violations; fines imposed, \$215.00.
From the Street and Water Departments—In addition to the regular work, sprinkling at the Park and on streets leading to same; repair of crosswalks in various parts of the city, and removal of rocks and boulders from streets. Two men went over the Beaver creek pipe line and made repairs where necessary to the phone line as well as the water pipes. All of the air valves and blow-off valves on this line are now in working order and everything possible has been done to try and increase the flow of water from Beaver creek. We are endeavoring to have the meter installed at the city reservoir in order that we may determine exactly what amount of water is delivered by the Beaver creek line. This will probably be done by the end of the present week. It is hoped that in the meantime the order made by the commission restricting the amount of water used for irrigation will enable us to supply domestic needs without using river water.
